Subject: Change in Maximum Allowable UI Benefit Weeks

Purpose: To notify MassHire Workforce Boards, MassHire Career Center Operators and

other workforce partners of the change in maximum allowable unemployment

insurance (UI) benefit weeks from 30 weeks to 26 weeks.

Background: Recently, the twelve-month average unemployment rate in all measured

metropolitan areas in Massachusetts reached 5.1% or lower. The Massachusetts

Unemployment Insurance statute, G.L. c. 151A, §30(a), provides that if the twelve-month average unemployment rate is equal to or below 5.1% in all measured metropolitan areas, there is an automatic adjustment to the

maximum allowable benefit period for new unemployment claims from 30 to 26

weeks.
