Subject: Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Joint Partner Local

Umbrella Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Purpose:

This document provides guidance for Local Workforce Development Boards (Local Board), WIOA Required Partners (OSCC Core Partners) and other stakeholders (as locally defined) regarding the development and submission of the WIOA Joint Partner Local Umbrella MOU.

Background: WIOA emphasizes full and effective partnerships between Local Boards and One-Stop Career Center Required Partners and other Partners (as locally defined) to improve job and career options for youth, job seekers, and businesses through collaboration in designing integrated services that place the customer at the center of the service delivery.

> In accordance with WIOA Regulations 20 CFR § 678.500, the local Umbrella MOU, a product of local discussion and negotiation, is an agreement developed and executed between the Local Board and the One-Stop Partners relating to the operation of the one-stop service delivery system in the local area.

The local Umbrella MOU is a tool that will define ery the divery methods and establish a stable and equitable funding stream or coing ne-stop operations. The MOU shall be developed in accordance wit WICA-sec. 121(c) (1) Memorandum of Understanding – Develope at. The Local Board, with the agreement of the Chief Elected Official, hall develop and enter into a memorandum of understanding (by teen to Local Board and the One-Stop Partners) concerning the partners ip of integration of services within the local area." WIOA allows the opt on of the development of a single "umbrella" MOU for a local area versus multiple different memoranda between Local Boards and each Partner (20 CFR 50.50.) assachusetts' state-level Partners have elected to implement he halla MOU model.

Definitions:

One-Sto Carter Center (OSCC) Required Partner: the Partners who are identified to ler WOA and included within the Massachusetts Combined State Plan, includin WIOA Title I (Adult, Dislocated Worker, Youth); Title II (Adult Education and Family Literacy); Title III (Wagner Peyser/Employment Service); Title IV (Vocational Rehabilitation); Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF); Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Unemployment Insurance (UI); Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA); Jobs for Veterans State Grant (JVSG) and the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP).

Shared Customer: OSCC Required Partners have agreed that youth, job seekers, and businesses who receive services from more than one OSCC Required Partner are considered "shared" customers. Shared customers benefit from services and resources delivered across multiple OSCC Partners and other stakeholders that are aligned to meet an individuals needs.

Policy:

The Local Board will convene OSCC Required Partners and other stakeholders (as defined locally) to discuss, develop, negotiate and execute a WIOA Joint Partner Local Umbrella MOU that specifies how services will be connected, integrated, or jointly designed in ways that improve outcomes for shared customers.

Many Local Boards have begun convening toward the development of Local Umbrella MOUs. For boards that have yet to begin the process, the Local Board, OSCC Required Partners and other stakeholders (as defined locally) will commence activity forthwith toward the development of the WIOA Joint Partner Local Umbrella MOU. Negotiations of the WIOA Joint Partner Local Umbrella MOU will be complete on or before June 16, 2017 and result in a fully executed Umbrella MOU by July 1, 2017, with an effective period of three years (July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2020.)

Note: MOUs must be updated as needed for change in frastructure cost contributions.

In the event that the Local Board and OSCC Required Fartners are unable to reach agreement with regard to how local One-States rices will be jointly delivered and funded, the Local Board mus notify he State Joard, Governor, and the WIOA Required State Partners as a simpasse has been reached.

Local Board Action Required:

The Local Board will convene the OSCC Required Partners and other stakeholders (as defined locally) to develop coordinated service delivery strategies for youth, job seekers, and businesses. The Local Board will engage with the OSCC Required Partners and other stakeholder to strategize integrated, person-centric service design and delivery within the One-Stop Career Center. The OSCC service design will be articulated in the Local WIOA Joint Partner Umbrella MOU effective July 1, 2017.
