WIOA Youth Service Provider Contract Extensions Subject:

During the COVD-19 Pandemic

Purpose: To notify MassHire Workforce Boards, MassHire Career Center Operators, and

MassHire Youth Program Operators of guidance related to contract extensions

for WIOA Youth Program service providers during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Background: On March 10, 2020 Governor Baker declared a State of Emergency to respond to

COVID-19. On March 23, 2020, the Governor subsequently issued an Essential Services And Revised Gatherings Order requiring all businesses and organizations

that do not provide "COVID-19 Essential Services" to close their physical

workplaces and facilities to workers, customers, and the public.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, WIOA activities and requirements may be impacted by the loss of operational capacity, increased costs, and social distancing protocols. As such, Workforce Boards may exercise cautious flexibility by extending existing youth service provider contracts for up to a 12-month period. Youth service provider contract extensions are intended to mitigate challenges related to the procurement process for youth service providers and provide program continuity amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

Policy:

During the COVID- 19 pandemic, Workforce Boards may allow contract extensions for existing youth service providers for up to a 12-month period as long as the youth service provider is in good fiscal, program and performance standing.

Local Workforce Boards must document contract extensions as a result of COVID-19 and adjust existing contracts and agreements along with corresponding budgets as well as conform to applicable Federal law and Uniform Guidance.

Action

Requested: MassHire Workforce Boards shall exercise due diligence to ensure that youth

service providers whose contracts are subject to this extension allowance are in

good standing related to fiscal and program activities and performance.

Effective: Immediately
