Trained CCRT members help validate the challenging stress reactions that often accompany OUI incidents; serve as immediate emergency counselors for victims; provide intervention in several effective therapeutic modalities; help link victims to appropriate community resources; and facilitate linking victims to one another for peer support and for the restorative process of community-building.
