WIOA Steering Committee Meeting on January 11, 2016

Yashira advised the group that the next WIOA Steering Committee was scheduled for January 11. It is not clear to what extent Performance Measures will be discussed.

Proposed State Performance Metrics

Marilyn and Yashira continued the discussion on proposed State performance measures based on comments received from the partners. Several decisions remain pending the final federal report requirements. See page 3 for the updated draft measures chart based on meeting discussions.

Status on Benchmark Data

MRC – data exchange completed; second exchange in process

MCB – data exchange in process

ACLS – MOU being finalized; data exchange format resolved

Future Data Exchanges

Yashira advised the group that she was reaching out to Cari Birkhauser, DUA Director of Systems Integration, to attend a future meeting (tentative for January 21) to brief her on federal reporting requirements that will impact DUA on the systems side, primarily with respect to wage matching, but also data provided by DUA to DCS for Trade program reporting. This will begin the discussions on business requirements for the data exchanges necessary for each agency to submit their required federal reports. Until these are fully understood and agreed to new MOUs cannot be developed, although discussions also need to begin with the respective legal counsels. Wage match results for federal reporting are at the individual level (with a substitute number for SSN) not the aggregate level provided for benchmarking.

Customer Privacy and Information Release Policies

There was a brief discussion regarding customer notice/release with respect to use of personal information (including SSN needed for wage matching) needed for federal reporting. Each partner agreed to research its agency's current protocols/policies. The group felt that legal counsels should be aware and ensure that each agency's minimum thresholds are satisfied in MOUs for wage matching and future data exchanges. The long-term goal is to create a common intake format and exchange service information on shared customers.
