## Child Care Financial Assistance Reimbursement Rates

EEC reimburses early education and out-of-school time programs that serve families receiving EEC child care financial assistance with a daily per child reimbursement rate.

These rates subsidize costs and provide purchasing power for families receiving child care financial assistance.

EEC's daily reimbursement rate for child care financial assistance is based on multiple factors including:

## Highlights from the Cost Study



In most cases, the cost per child per day (assuming current compensation levels) was higher than the current EEC child care financial assistance reimbursement rate.



The cost to operate a program varied across regions, but not nearly as widely as current reimbursement rates:

- For centers, compared to the lowest-cost region (Western), the highest-cost region (Metro Boston) was approximately 18% more expensive for children under age 5 and 12% more expensive for school-age care.
- In contrast, the current reimbursement rates for Metro Boston are up to 52% more than the rates for the Western region.



Some regions had very similar costs: the Western, Central and Southeast regions had very similar costs, and the two Boston-area regions (Metro Boston and Metro) had very similar costs.



# Recommendations from Cost Study for Rate Structure

### **Geographic Coherence**



Align rate regions with licensing regions

#### **Economic Differentiation**



 Based on key economic indicators (e.g., HUD data on rent, median household income, Social Vulnerability Index), simplifying to either two or three rates makes sense

### Simplicity & Equity



 Use cost research to inform more equitable rates by age, region and type of care, and simplify rate structure



## FY24 & Beyond: Strategy for Rate Increases and Reforms



#### **Recognize Rising Operational Costs**

Use portion of funds for cost-of-living-adjustments (COLA)



## Use Cost-Informed Approach to Simplify Rate Structure and Address Geographic Inequity

- Consolidation of rates for regions that are similar according to cost data and other economic indicators
- Make progress toward rates covering the cost of care by region, provider type, and age



### **Progress toward Federal Market Rate Benchmark**

 Ensure significant movement toward rates meeting or exceeding 50th percentile of market rate by region, provider type, and age



### **Support Quality Investments**

Integrate quality funding into base rates

## **Considerations for Consolidating Rates**

- Consolidating rates can be a tool to (a) align rates between regions that are substantially similar across key economic indicators and (b) simplify the rate structure
- Economic analysis of EEC's six subsidy regions indicates:
  - Western, Central, and Southeastern Massachusetts (Regions 1, 2, and 5) are substantially similar
  - Metro and Metro Boston (Regions 4 and 6) are substantially similar
  - Northeastern Massachusetts (Region 3) is the largest EEC region and falls between Regions 1/2/5 and Regions 4/6 on key economic indicators
- When consolidating rates, regions with the lowest rates in their group receive the largest increases once consolidated, in order to match the rates of the other regions in their group
- The cost associated with consolidating rates (raising lower rates to align with higher rates in the group) means that increased consolidation results in less available funding for "COLA" rate increases or targeted increases to further address cost of care




## Two Rate Option – Variables & Considerations

#### **Variables**

- Apply a 3.7% across-the-board (ATB) cost-of-living adjustment (COLA)
- Consolidate Metro and Metro Boston rates
- Consolidate Western, Central, Northeast and Southeast rates
- No targeted increase possible beyond rate consolidation

#### **Considerations**

- 86% of rates are at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile of market rate (rates below 50<sup>th</sup>: 1 infant, 2 preschool, and 2 FCC over age two)
- 44% of rates are at or above full cost of care. The lowest % of cost of care moves from 56% to 73%
- **\$64.8M** is the estimated cost


## Three Rate Option – Variables & Considerations

#### **Variables**

- Apply a 5.5% across-the-board COLA
- Consolidate Metro & Metro Boston
- Consolidate Western, Central, and Southeast
- Northeast remains separate
- Increase consolidated rates for center-based care to 81% of the highest cost of care in the group (no targeted increase for FCCs due to \$20M cap)

#### **Considerations**

- 89% of rates are at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile of market rate (rates below 50<sup>th</sup>: 2 preschool and 2 FCC over 2 rates)
- 44% of rates are at or above full cost of care. The lowest % of cost of care moves from 56% to 72%
- **\$65M** is the estimated cost




## Four Rate Option – Variables & Considerations

#### **Variables**

- Apply a 7% across-the-board COLA
- Consolidate Western, Central, and Southeast
- Northeast remains separate
- Metro remains separate
- Metro Boston remains separate
- No targeted rate increase beyond consolidation

#### **Considerations**

- 83% of rates are at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile of market (rates below 50<sup>th</sup>: 1 infant, 2 preschool and 3 FCC over 2 rates)
- 42% of rates are at or above full cost of care. The lowest % of cost of care moves from 56% to 66%
- **\$64.5M** is the estimated cost




## Four Rates: Progress Towards 50<sup>th</sup> Percentile of Market Rate




## **Considerations for Family Child Care**

- We have developed a comparable proposal for FCC rates:
  - The same consolidation options are applied.
  - FCCs would receive the same COLA as center-based programs.
  - Remaining funds would be used on targeted increases based on the cost of care, to the extent possible, although the % cost of care may differ between center-based and family child care based on available funding for each care type.
  - The quality add-on is incorporated into FCC system administrator base rates and the QRIS add-on is incorporated into FCC system and provider rates.
- All FCC rates are subject to negotiation with SEIU Local 509.

## **Additional Reimbursement Rate Recommendations**

 Increase add-on rates for supportive, teen, and homeless reimbursements by \$1 to \$24 per day

- Adjust FCC system administrative (admin) rates to be consistent with the option selected:
  - The COLA is applied before consolidation.
  - The system admin rate would then be raised to match the highest system admin rate in the new consolidated group.

## 2023 Progress – End of Year Review

#### **Continued Investment in Agency Capacity & Structure**

- Building on the new organizational structure set in 2022, filled over 50 key positions to further actualize the strategic action plan with a focus on equity and inclusion
- Recruitment and hiring in key areas: product management, research and data analytics, workforce support and development, family engagement and child care financial assistance
- Approved to add 28 new positions in FY24, which EEC is actively working to post and hire now

#### **Modernizing Background Records Checks**

- Continued modernization of EEC's Background Record Checks system to bring Residential and Placement programs (R&P) into the state's Navigator system and added an out-of-state background records check for residential program candidates
  - New average processing time for submissions: Placement Agencies = 1 day and 21 hours; Residential Programs = 4 days and 23 hours
- Launched one background record check consent form for all program types
- Planning for retirement of the Legacy system

#### Reimagining Child Care Financial Assistance (CCFA)

- Launched significant reforms to CCFA regulations and interim policies to simplify the application process, reduce paperwork, and better support homeless families, families with disabilities and families facing domestic violence
  - EEC is currently half-way through a comprehensive training program for Family Access Administrators on the changes
- Launched new family facing web pages at Mass.gov/CCFA
- Procured new contracts for resource and referral services with Child Care Resource and Referral agencies
- Kicked off procurement activities for Income-Eligible, Supportive, Homeless and Young Parent program contracts
- Simplified Child Care Resource and Referral Agency regions to streamline process for families/providers and align with licensing regions
- Launched text messaging to families in English/Spanish when financial assistance becomes available to streamline the application process
- Conducted outreach to families on the waitlist to ensure it is up-to-date
- Implemented an historic \$80M increase to the daily reimbursement rates to providers who serve families receiving CCFA





## 2023 Progress – End of Year Review

#### **Supporting ECE Providers and Educators**

- Career Pathways
  - Launched optional Director certification (currently available statewide), and Teacher/Lead Teacher in Western MA (others following)
  - Drafted competencies for the educator credential aligned with quality domains
  - Moving all EEC PDC professional development opportunities to EEC's StrongStart Online Professional Development System
- Access to Higher Education
  - In collaboration with DHE, revising the ECE Higher Education Scholarship Program to improve accessibility and expand eligibility
  - Partnership with MACC and Career Pathways grantees to expand credit for prior learning
- Workforce Pipeline
  - Hosted 3 Apprenticeship Convenings to identify opportunities for EEC investment
  - Enrolled fourth cohort of ECSO (27 programs, 156 classrooms) to provide intensive support for center-based program directors
  - Stable and Competitive Employment Opportunities
  - Continued C3 funding reaching 8,197 providers
    - Application data shows salary increases since 2021
  - ECE Staff Pilot providing access to child care financial assistance for 1,252 educators with 1,759 children
  - Added in LEAD a voluntary way for family child care assistants looking for employment to connect with providers who are hiring
- Expanded Program Supports
  - Expanded CPPI communities to a total of 21 working to expand local preschool access
  - Invested additional \$1.5 million in early childhood mental health consultation services (through ECMH grant)
  - Announced \$300,000 in Massachusetts FRESH grants for schools and early education and care programs
  - Awarded \$8.5 million to 20 organizations across the Commonwealth in FY23 EEOST capital funding
  - Administration's FY24-28 Capital Plan increases EEOST funding by \$4 million a year each year
  - Opened applications for \$14.3 million in capital funding for early education and care programs, first time includes for-profit programs

#### **Foundational Regulatory Review**

Launched regulatory review process for EEC's R&P programs, as well as child care licensing
