Who We Are

DLC is a nonprofit legal services agency designated by the Governor as the federally mandated Protection and Advocacy (P&A) agency for Massachusetts. The P&A system is a national network of disability rights agencies investigating abuse and neglect and providing legal representation and other advocacy services to people with disabilities. DLC has federal authority to monitor any facility or service provider in Massachusetts that provides care and treatment to individuals with disabilities.

In addition to its Core Functions, DLC has Focus Areas that are developed through input from the disability community. DLC's Focus Areas address issues that threaten the safety, rights and independence of people with disabilities. Based on capacity, DLC focuses on:

- Civil Rights (disability discrimination, employment and housing accommodations, program access, voting access)
- Health Care
- Systemic Serious Human Rights
- Legal Aid for Victims of Crime

DLC is committed to protecting the civil and human rights of all people with disabilities through zealous advocacy and representation.
