### Purpose of Stakeholder Sessions

- DMH will procure a peer support training and certification program as a contract within the Client and Community Empowerment Activity Code.

# National Vision for Peer Support within Healthcare Systems

#### Peer support roles

- Advocating with people in recovery
- Sharing resources and building skills
- Building community and relationships
- Leading recovery groups
- Mentoring and setting goals
- Examples of integrated peer support
  - Whole Health Action Management (WHAM)
  - Chronic Disease Self-Management
  - Health and Recovery Peer Program (HARP)
- Financing of peer support (including third party)
- Development of core competencies for peer support



# National Landscape of Peer Support Training and Certification Programs

- Nationally, there are a number of models for peer support training and certification
- Examples of programs that are in use in multiple states
  - Appalachian Consulting Group Peer Specialist Core Recovery Curriculum Training
  - RI International Peer Employment Training
  - Intentional Peer Support
  - DBSA Peer Specialist Training



# Vision for Certified Peer Support in the Commonwealth

- Numerous practice settings, including general healthcare, mental health and integrated behavioral healthcare systems are moving in the direction of integrating peer support into these settings with:
  - Multiple examples of how peer support is implemented in these systems
  - Multiple payment opportunities
- Numerous funders are including peer support as a delivery system requirement



#### Peer Support in the Commonwealth

- Examples of peer support in Executive Office of Health and Human Services/MassHealth programs
  - Accountable Care Organizations/Community Partners
  - One Care
  - Children's Behavioral Health Initiative
  - Frail Elder Waiver
  - Emergency Service Programs
  - Living Rooms
  - ▶ 1115 Waiver Services
  - Bureau of Substance Abuse Services
  - Department of Veterans' Services
- Examples of Peer Support Roles
  - Recovery Coaches
  - Community Health Workers
  - Navigators
  - Homeless Peer Support



#### **DMH Vision**

- DMH services aligned and integrated with healthcare and employment service systems
  - Care coordination
  - Integrated behavioral and physical health
  - Integrated behavioral health (mental health and addiction conditions)
  - Integrated employment service delivery and housing supports
- DMH seeks a peer support training and certification program that can prepare class attendees to work in any healthcare setting in the Commonwealth
  - Some settings may require specialized training
- The delivery system is dynamic and evolving
  - DMH anticipates that the delivery of certified peer support training will need ongoing development to stay current with a changing delivery system

#### Peer Support in DMH

- Examples of certified peer support roles in DMH services
  - Inpatient facilities
  - Program for Assertive Community Treatment
  - ACCS
  - Site Offices
- Examples of other DMH services that include peer roles:
  - Caring Together
  - Flex
  - Leadership positions
