NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

Notice is hereby given that the Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources (DOER) will hold a public meeting in response to a petition filed by the Conservation Law Foundation (CLF) for DOER to initiate one or more rulemaking proceedings to promulgate new and amended regulations to implement the Commonwealth's Global Warming Solutions Act, An Act Creating a Next-Generation Roadmap for Massachusetts Climate Policy, and An Act Driving Clean Energy and Offshore Wind (Petition). The Petition was submitted by CLF on May 3, 2023 pursuant to G.L. c. 30A, § 4. For the purposes of the Petition, DOER will be following the process adopted by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection at 310 CMR 2.00 et seq for consideration of petitions under G.L. c. 30A, §4. In accordance with the relevant provisions of 310 CMR 2.00 et seq., DOER must hold a public meeting in response to the Petition and notify CLF of any actions it plans to take in response to the Petition within 10 days of the public meeting.

At the meeting, DOER will allow time for CLF to present information about the Petition, and as time allows, offer the opportunity for comment by interested parties.
