Please join MassDOT at the first public meeting and open house on the East-West Passenger Rail Study. The study will examine the costs, benefits, and investments necessary to implement a range of passenger rail service alternatives from Boston to Springfield and Pittsfield, up to and including high speed rail. The goal of the meeting is to:

- Inform attendees about the study scope and existing conditions on the corridor
- Learn from attendees about what they would like to see in rail service alternatives

The meeting will begin with a presentation at **6:00 PM**, followed by time for Q+A. The open house will begin at **6:45 PM**, where participants can view study materials in more detail and speak directly with members of the study team.

*Parking: If you would like to park in the Tower Square garage, parking will be validated at \$5 per car. Meeting attendees can park on all levels but are encouraged to park on Level A.
