On May 1, 2008, DSCI Corporation ("DSCI") filed a Complaint with the Massachusetts Department of Telecommunications and Cable ("Department"), pursuant to G. L. c. 159, §§ 10, 12, 13, 14, 16, and 19, against Verizon New England Inc. d/b/a Verizon Massachusetts ("Verizon"). In its Complaint, DSCI alleges that DSCI and its customers are entitled to receive the Assume 9 dialing feature in connection with the resale of Verizon's customer specific pricing agreement with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (the "COMA CSP contract"). DSCI requests an expedited ruling on its Complaint because the parties are unable to agree whether resale of the COMA CSP contract includes the Assume 9 dialing feature. The Department anticipates the filing of an answer by Verizon by May 9, 2008. The Department will hold a public and evidentiary hearing to investigate the Complaint filed by DSCI. The hearing will take place at:

The Complaint and responsive pleadings may be viewed at the Department's offices Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., or on the Department's website. Any person who desires to file written comments or to participate otherwise in this proceeding shall file an original and three (3) copies of such written comments or petition for leave to intervene in the proceeding with Catrice C. Williams, Secretary, Department of Telecommunications and Cable, Two South Station, Boston, MA 02110, no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on Thursday, May 29, 2008. All written pleadings or comments must indicate the docket number of this matter (D.T.C. 08-4) and must be served on counsel for all parties. The current service list is available from the Department. Any questions regarding this proceeding should be directed to Catrice C. Williams at catrice.williams@state.ma.us or at 617-368-1120. A petition for leave to intervene must satisfy the timing and substantive requirements of 220 C.M.R. §1.03. Receipt by the Department, not mailing, constitutes filing and determines whether a petition has been timely filed. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 C.M.R. §1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 C.M.R. §1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G. L. c. 30A, § 10. All written pleadings or comments also should be submitted to the Department in electronic format by e-mail attachment to dte.filing@state.ma.us (copy to betsy.whitney@state.ma.us). The text of the e-mail must specify: (1) an easily identifiable case caption; (2) the docket number; (3) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (4) a brief descriptive title of document (e.g., comments or petition to intervene). The electronic filing should also include the name, title, and phone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing. Text responses should be written in either Word Perfect (naming the document with a ".wpd" suffix), Microsoft Word (naming the document with a ".doc" suffix), or submitted as an Adobe document (naming the document with a ".pdf" suffix).
