

Information Request VZ-DSCI 1 - 1

Referring to the unnumbered page following the page entitled "Summary Sheet" in Exhibit DSCI 1-3, please provide: (a) the mathematical calculations for each of the annual entries in the row labeled "Ave. Cost/Line per Month"; (b) the mathematical calculations for each of the annual entries in the row labeled "COMA Cost/Per Line w/Resale Discount"; (c) the basis, assumptions, tariff references and rationale for each of the components of each calculation.

Response

(a) The mathematical calculations in the referenced row are set forth in DSCI's Response to Department Information Request D.T.C. – DSCI 1-7(a) and (b). The numbers used in calculating the averages for each year are as follows:

For ease of analysis, DSCI has prepared a matrix attached as Exhibit VZ-DSCI 1-1(a) that illustrates the calculation of the average line rate based upon quantity and class of service for each year.

For prior years, DSCI ascertained its costs for each of the class-of-service lines by reviewing invoice for each class-of-service for each period.

Information Request VZ-DSCI 1 - 2

Referring to Exhibit DSCI 1-3, please provide, for each listed Account/BTN Number, and for each month during the period: (a) the name or tariff reference for the per-line service offering that DSCI purchased from Verizon MA and resold to the customer; (b) the amount per-line actually charged by Verizon MA and paid by DSCI; (c) the number of lines in service that month; and (d) the total amount billed by Verizon MA to DSCI for the line charges to the Account Number. Please provide the response in a hard copy and an electronic copy in Excel spreadsheet format with all links, formulas and cell references intact.

Response

DSCI has already provided Verizon with the class of service, service lines, billing telephone number (“BTN”) and working telephone numbers (“WTN”) for each account that would enable Verizon needs to make these calculations on its own. Furthermore, as DSCI’s wholesale provider, Verizon already has in its possession the rates charged by Verizon for the referenced DSCI accounts. Where the burden of deriving or ascertaining the answer to a response is substantially the same for the party serving the interrogatory and the party being served, it is a sufficient answer for such interrogatory to identify the records in question and allow the party to perform its own calculations. Here, the records are already in Verizon’s possession and Verizon cannot compel DSCI to perform the requested calculations. See Mass. R. Civ. P. 33(c).

Furthermore, the request for a line-by-line calculation of DSCI’s claims against Verizon is grossly and excessively burdensome. DSCI’s billing data records are not archived in a manner that would generate the requested data though automated means and, thus, creating billing detail on a line-by-line basis would require significant manual effort.

If, however, Verizon agrees to make a payment to DSCI as requested by DSCI in this remand proceeding, DSCI is willing to undertake a line-by-line calculation in order to verify the amounts owed.

Information Request VZ-DSCI 1 – 3

Referring to Exhibit DSCI 1-3, please provide for each listed Account/BTN Number, and for each month during the period: (a) the name or tariff reference for the usage service offering that DSCI purchased from Verizon MA and resold to the customer; (b) the unit rate for usage actually charged by Verizon MA and paid by DSCI; (c) the minutes of usage DSCI billed to the customer; and (d) the total amount billed by Verizon MA to DSCI for usage for the Account Number. Please provide the response in a hard copy and an electronic copy in Excel spreadsheet format with all links, formulas and cell references intact.

Response

DSCI already has stated in its Comments and DSCI's Response to Department Information Request D.T.C. – DSCI 1-7(a) that DSCI's claim is for overpayment of monthly recurring line charges rather than overpayment of usage rates. Accordingly, Verizon's request seeking calculation of usage rate information on DSCI's accounts is irrelevant to this remand proceeding.

Furthermore, also as stated in DSCI's Comments and Response to Department Information Request D.T.C. – DSCI 1-7(a), DSCI has used Corporate Rewards usage rates on all lines in question. DSCI has already provided Verizon with the class of service, service lines, BTN and WTN for each account that would enable Verizon needs to make these calculations on its own. Furthermore, as DSCI's wholesale provider, Verizon already has in its possession the Corporate Rewards rates charged by Verizon for the referenced DSCI accounts. Where the burden of deriving or ascertaining the answer to a response is substantially the same for the party serving the interrogatory and the party being served, it is a sufficient answer for such interrogatory to identify the records in question and allow the party to perform its own calculations. Here, the records are already in Verizon's possession and Verizon cannot compel DSCI to perform the requested calculations. See Mass. R. Civ. P. 33(c).

Information Request VZ-DSCI 1 – 4

Referring to Exhibit DSCI 1-3, please provide for each listed customer, and for each month during the period all documentation and all facts establishing that the customer was, during that month, an “eligible entity” under the subject COMA CSP contract.

Response

For the period in question, with the exception noted below, the eligible entities listed in Exhibit DSCI 1-3 were, to the best of DSCI’s knowledge, state or municipal entities or nonprofit human resource agencies that qualified for COMA CSP contract pricing. Virtually all of the entities listed on Exhibit 1-3 are expressly listed on the Commonwealth of MA Operational Services Division "OSD" website. The OSD website is

<http://www.mass.gov/?pageID=osdtopic&L=3&sid=Aosd&L0=Home&L1=Buy+from+a+Contract&L2=Eligible+Entities>. With respect to the handful of remaining entities, DSCI has obtained a tax exempt certificate with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for Vinfen Corporation (“Vin-Fen”) and it should be properly qualified for COMA CSP pricing under Verizon’s tariffs. The referenced tax exempt certificate for Vin-Fen is attached hereto as Exhibit Verizon-DSCI 1-4. Discussions between DSCI and the Commonwealth OSD indicate that Vin-Fen is viewed as an eligible entity during the entire period in question. Moreover, DSCI possesses, and has attached in its response to Information Request D.T.C.-DSCI 1-7(a) at Exhibit DSCI-1-7, a Verizon CSR form offering COMA CSP pricing to Vin-Fen.

DSCI has determined that it will not press its claim for eligibility status for the following entities listed on Exhibit VZ-DSCI 1-3 that have been questioned by Verizon in informal discussions: Marian Court College; Morton Physician Associates Inc.; Sisters of Divine Providence; and TechSkills LLC. DSCI will provide revised public and confidential versions of Exhibit DSCI 1-3 well in advance of the scheduled hearing date.
