Seidel wins in Atlanta

Captures half marathon in personal record 1:08.29

Almost one year to the day that Molly Seidel finished runner-up at the 2020 Atlanta Marathon to qualify for the now-postponed Tokyo Olympics, the 26-year-old Cambridge resident on Sunday won the Atlanta Half Marathon at Atlanta Motor Speedway with a personal record of 1 hour, 8 minutes, 29 seconds.

The conditions this year (temperature in the mid-30s, almost 100 percent humidity) were different than a year ago, but Seidel was happy to win in Atlanta.

“It was really cool to be back here a year later under different conditions, but it’s always special to return to the place that it happened,” Siedel told the Globe.

Seidel, a former NCAA cross-country and track and field star at Notre Dame, burst onto the marathon scene with her surprising finish last March 1 in the 2020 Olympic Marathon trials, her first-ever

marathon.

She was an NCAA champion in cross-country, the 3,000-meter and 5,000-meter indoor races, and the 10,000-meter outdoor race, but never competed in a marathon until last year.

The COVID-19 pandemic and related shut-downs less than two weeks later postponed the Olympics to July of this year, but since then Seidel has been training intermittently in Flagstaff, Ariz., moved from the Fenway neighborhood to Cambridge, and ran the London Marathon last October, where she was the second-fastest American woman (sixth place, 2:25.13).

Siedel said Atlanta was either the fourth or fifth half marathon she’s run. She said much of the course layout, which featured the last three miles within the speedway’s infield, was similar to what the flat Olympic Marathon course in Sapporo, Japan, will be.

“The humidity [today] was actually pretty good prep for it because it will be much hotter but similar humidity,” she said.

Seidel will begin a more regimented training program approximately 12-15 weeks before she travels to Tokyo for the Olympics.

Morikawa captures WGC

Wins Workday title by 3 shots

PGA champion Collin Morikawa shook off an early mistake and played a steady hand on a Concession golf course known for calamity, closing with a 3-under 69 for a three-shot victory in the Workday Championship in Bradenton, Fla.

Morikawa picked up a few short-game tips from major champions — Mark O’Meara on his putting, Concession member Paul Azinger on the chipping — and said it carried him to another big win.

And there was a tribute to Tiger Woods, his golf idol growing up.

“We don’t say ‘Thank you’ enough,” Morikawa said, referring to how much Woods has raised the profile and prize money in golf. He also mentioned his grandfather dying a month ago and began to get emotional.

Morikawa won by three over Brooks Koepka (70), Viktor Hovland (67) and Billy Horschel (70).

He finished at 18-under 270 and became the 24th player to win a major and a World Golf Championship title since this series began in 1999. He joined Woods as the only players to win both before turning 25.

There were red numbers on the board and on the golf course, with several players wearing red shirts and black pants — the Sunday colors of Woods — as a show of support as Woods recovers from career-threatening leg injuries from his car crash in Los Angeles last Tuesday.

“Red and black, we know that’s what Tiger does on Sundays, so just to join in and just let Tiger know we’re supporting him in the best way we can,” Tony Finau said. “We’re still playing and we miss him out here, but it was cool just to be a part of that.”

Morikawa didn’t have the colors, but he had the game.

So many times on Sundays, Woods had the lead and forced everyone to catch him. Outside of a chunked chip on the second hole that made him scramble for bogey, Morikawa didn’t miss a fairway the rest of the way and

was rarely out of position.

Horschel caught Morikawa after three holes and tried to stay with him. Koepka had the last good chance to catch him until he three-putted for par from 35 feet on the par-5 17th hole.

Hovland, who finished his second round with a quadruple bogey, might have had the best chance of all. Hovland somehow managed to punch out of the wire grass and onto the green to make birdie on the par-5 13th, his seventh birdie of the round that pulled him with one shot.

His hopes effectively ended on the next hole.

Just as Morikawa was pouring in an 8-foot birdie putt on the short par-4 12th hole, Hovland ran his 40-foot birdie putt some 15 feet past the hole on the par-3 14th, and missed the par putt.

Morikawa’s lead was back to three shots, and he never flinched the rest of the day.

“I think it’s good just for everyone to show their appreciation for what he means to us out here,” Rory McIlroy said of the tribute to Woods.

LPGA — Nelly Korda seized control with three early birdies and finished with 12 straight pars for a 3-under 69 to win the Gainbridge LPGA in Boca Raton, Fla., giving the Korda family two victories to start the season.

Her older sister, Jessica, won the season-opening Tournament of Champions last month in Orlando.

Korda won for the first time on American soil — her other three LPGA wins were in Australia and twice in Taiwan — and the first time with her parents watching. Her father, Petr Korda, is a former Australian Open tennis champion.

On the other side of the course, Annika Sorenstam wrapped up her return after more than 12 years of retirement with a par on the ninth hole for a 76, finishing last among the 74 players who made the cut. The 50-year-old Swede was making this one-time appearance because Lake Nona has been her home course for two decades.

Sorenstam finished 29 shots behind Korda, who won by three over Lexi Thompson and Lydia Ko.

Champions — Kevin Sutherland chipped in for birdie at No. 16 and had a tap-in for another on the next hole, shooting a 4-under 69 to overtake Mike Weir in the Colguard Classic in Tucson, Ariz.

PGA — Branden Grace closed eagle-birdie to win the Puerto Rico Open, an emotional triumph following the death of his father, Peter, in January after a month-long fight with the coronavirus.

Grace holed out from a greenside bunker for eagle on the par-4 17th and birdied the par-5 18th for a one-stroke victory over Jhonattan Vegas at windy Grand Reserve in Rio Grande, Puerto Rico.

Byron triumphs at Homestead

HOMESTEAD, Fla. — William Byron gave NASCAR its third surprise winner in three weeks, this one not quite as stunning as the first two at Daytona International Speedway.

Byron controlled most of the final two stages at Homestead-Miami Speedway on Sunday and won for the second time in 111 Cup starts. His first one came at Daytona last August and landed him one of the final spots in the playoffs.

No one saw that one coming.

And few had this one on the radar, either.

Byron entered the weekend

as a 28-1 shot to win a race many expected would provide a return to normal for the racing series. Instead, Michael McDowell and Christopher Bell have company in the relatively odd group of 2021 winners.

Byron hardly qualifies as even close to as much of a shocker as the previous two — both first-time winners — because he drives the famed No. 24 for Hendrick Motorsports. But he also hadn’t exactly been a regular in victory lane.

Then again, those inside the Hendrick organization had a feeling he could be in for something big this season since he reunited with former crew chief Rudy Fugle.

“That guy has been huge for my career,” Byron said. “He’s the reason I’m here and I’m just glad we could get him.”

They had their best year together while running the Truck Series for Kyle Busch Motorsports in 2016, even winning at Homestead.

When Byron’s former crew chief, Chad Knaus, moved up at Hendrick Motorsports, Rick Hendrick hired Fugle and paired him with Byron. It was a rare move for Hendrick, who typically grooms his crew chiefs from within the organization.

Tyler Reddick was second, nearly 3 seconds back, followed by Martin Truex Jr., Kyle Larson and Kevin Harvick.
