**FOURTH SET OF INFORMATION REQUESTS BY THE
DEPARTMENT OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND CABLE
TO BOOST SUBSCRIBERCO, L.L.C.**

Pursuant to 207 C.M.R. § 1.06(6)(c), the Department of Telecommunications and Cable
("Department") submits to Boost SubscriberCo, L.L.C. the following information requests:

Instructions

The following instructions apply to this set of information requests.

1. All answers should be filed with the Department by the close of business on September 11, 2026.
2. Unless otherwise stated, each request should be answered in writing and include: the case docket number; a reference to the request number; the name of the person responsible for the answer; and a recitation of the request.
3. The term "affiliate" means a person that (directly or indirectly) owns or controls, is owned or controlled by, or is under common ownership or control with, DISH. For purposes of this definition, the term "own" means to own an equity interest (or the equivalent thereof) of more than 10 percent.
4. The term "DISH" means DISH Wireless L.L.C. d/b/a Gen Mobile and its corporate predecessors, agents, officers, employees, and assigns.
5. The term "Amended Petition" means DISH amended application for designation as an ETC which the Department received on December 5, 2024.
6. The term "ETC" means eligible telecommunications carrier.
7. The term "FCC" means the Federal Communications Commission.
8. The term "USF" means Universal Service Fund.

9. The term “USAC” means the Universal Service Administrative Company.
10. The term “Boost” means Boost SubscriberCo, L.L.C. and its corporate predecessors, agents, officers, employees, and assigns.
11. The term “document” is used in its broadest sense and includes, without limitation, writings, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, phono-records, microfilm, microfiche, computer printouts, correspondence, press releases, handwritten and/or typed notes, records, reports, bills, checks, articles from journals and/or other sources, legal filings, e-mails, SMS text messages, blog postings, RSS feeds, web pages, social media postings such as Facebook and Twitter, and/or other data compilations from which information can be obtained and all copies of such documents that bear notations or other markings that differentiate such copies from the original.
12. The term “provide complete and detailed documentation” means provide all data, assumptions and calculations relied upon. Provide the source of and basis for all data and assumptions employed. Include all studies, reports and planning documents from which data, estimates or assumptions were drawn and support for how the data or assumptions were used by DISH in developing the projections or estimates.
13. Requests shall be deemed continuing so as to require further supplemental responses if Boost and/or its witnesses receive or generate additional information within the scope of these requests between the time of the original response and the close of the record in this proceeding.
14. If any of these requests are ambiguous, notify the Hearing Officer so that the request may be clarified prior to the preparation of a written response.

Requests

- D.T.C. 4-1 Provide Boost's most recent annual profit and loss statement and balance sheet.
- D.T.C. 4-2 Provide detail as to what assets were specifically transferred from DISH to Boost and further explain the transfer of "certain assets" that was referenced in the amendment to the petition filed with the Department on November 17, 2025. Provide any formal documentation that accompanied the transfer, including an explanation of the terms and conditions of the transfer.
- D.T.C. 4-3 Provide detail regarding the level of oversight DISH or any affiliate will exercise over Boost, including whether Boost will operate as an independent company or whether DISH or any affiliate will retain authority over Boost's management decisions.
- D.T.C. 4-4 Identify any debts Boost will assume as result of the DISH bankruptcy filed in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Texas on June 30, 2026.
- D.T.C. 4-5 Elaborate whether the above referenced DISH bankruptcy is expected to have any impact on Boost's financial, operational, or technical ability to provide reliable Lifeline service to eligible Massachusetts households, including any effects on service continuity, customer support, network access or Boost's ability to meet its Lifeline obligations.
- D.T.C. 4-6 Provide a list of states in which Boost has been approved as an ETC and the date of any such approval.
