Lawsuits follow data breach at Citizens

Bank says action was 'limited' for some customers

PROVIDENCE — Citizens Bank is facing two class action lawsuits after a few thousand of its customers were impacted by a data breach.

The Providence-headquartered bank disclosed the breach in a statement on Tuesday, saying it was "managing an incident involving data extracted from a third party vendor."

"For Citizens, most of this was masked test data, although a limited set of information for a small number of customers was involved," the statement said. "There is no evidence of unauthorized access to the Citizens network, and our operations continue as normal."

According to Rory Sheehan, a spokesperson for Citizens, masked data replaces sensitive data such as names, account numbers, and Social Security numbers, with "realistic but fake values, so people and systems can work with the data without seeing real confidential information."

Sheehan wrote in an email on Friday. "No other types of data was involved."

Sheehan wrote Citizens does not have "any evidence of fraud resulting from this event."

"The small number of customers who were affected by this will be contacted directly by us," Sheehan wrote, adding that a "few thousand customers will get either an email or letter from Citizens related to this."

Citizens has approximately 1,000 branches in 14 states and the District of Columbia, according to its website.

Affected customers' accounts will be monitored, Sheehan wrote.

Two class action lawsuits were filed against Citizens by victims of the breach in US District Court in Providence on Wednesday, records show.

The lawsuits, brought by Jillian Russell Hauser, an Ohio resident, and Lorien Hansford, a Maine resident, allege Citizens was hacked by Everest, a cybercriminal syndicate.

Russell Hauser's lawsuit said Everest leaked information on the dark web that it had stolen.

Both lawsuits accuse the company of negligence and of breaching implied contracts to safeguard customer data. Each seeks damages of more than \$5 million.

"Data breach class actions, like this case against Citizens Bank, aim to hold companies responsible when they fail to protect personal information, while ensuring that those affected have access to meaningful, long-term safeguards against misuse of their data," Peter N. Wasylyk, an attorney representing Russell Hauser, said in an emailed statement on Friday.

Responding to the lawsuits, Sheehan wrote "the claims are generally inaccurate."

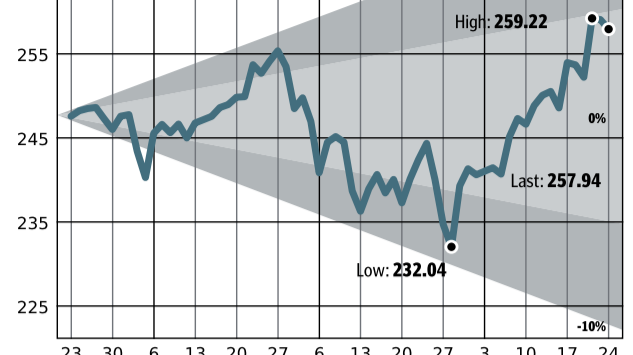

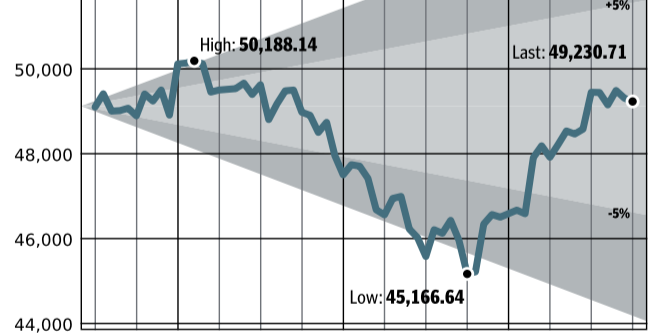

Market rises on hopes for talks

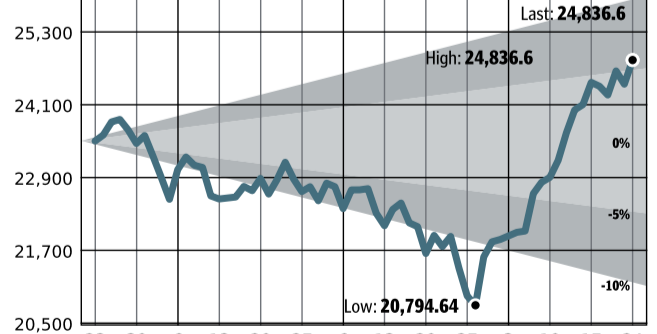
Hopes that the US and Iran will be back to the negotiating table lifted stocks to all-time highs, with the market also rising after a blowout forecast from Intel Corp. and the closing of a probe into Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell. A nearly 1% gain in the S&P 500 on Friday drove the index to its longest weekly advance since 2024. President Donald Trump will send two envoys to Pakistan with the intention of talking with Iranian officials. US crude dropped to around \$94. Treasury yields fell as the Justice Department's decision on Powell potentially cleared a path to Kevin Warsh's confirmation as the next Fed leader, with traders boosting bets on interest-rate cuts. Special envoy Steve Witkoff and the president's son-in-law Jared Kushner are set to depart Saturday for talks this weekend, White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt told Fox News. The New York Times reported that Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi plans to meet with the US delegation and intends to present a written response to a peace proposal. Traders have been closely tracking the movements of both delegations for signals on whether peace talks will materialize, hoping for a resumption of flows through the vital Strait of Hormuz. Despite geopolitical risks, strong corporate earnings and an otherwise resilient economy have buoyed equities. (BLOOMBERG)

DOW JONES industrial average



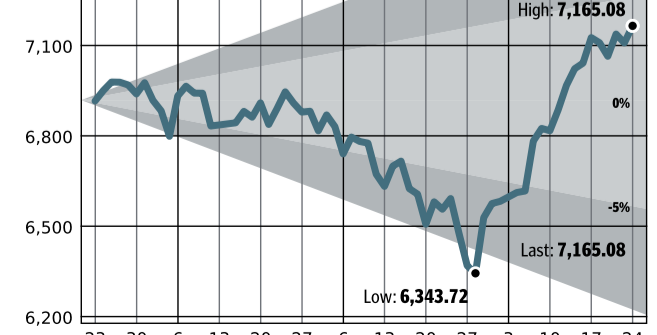
