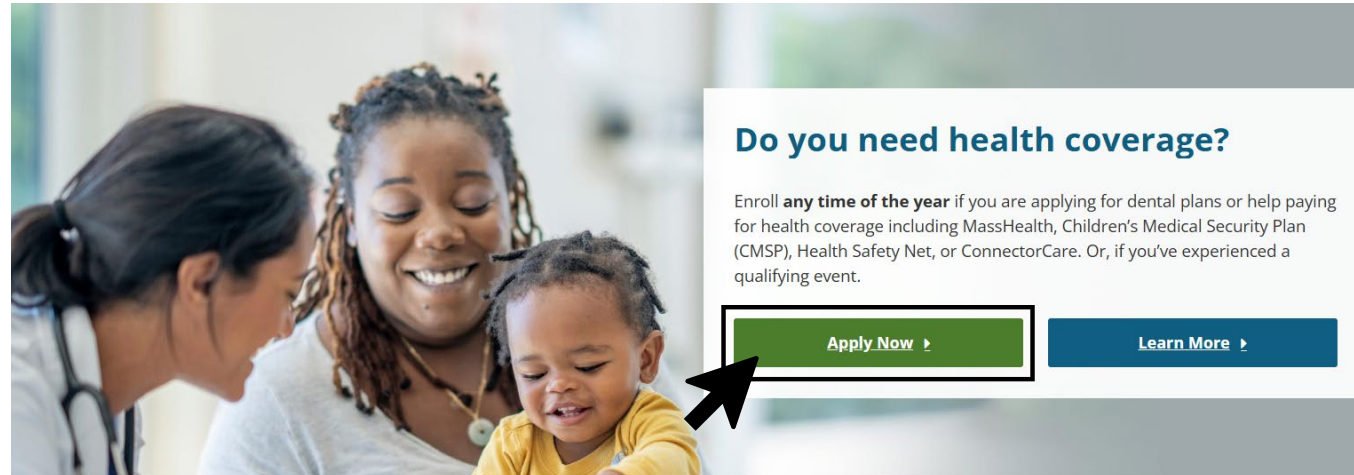
# Comparing MassHealth & Health Connector

- **MassHealth** is the Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) in Massachusetts
- Provides free or low-cost health coverage to eligible individuals
- Administered by the state and funded by state and federal governments
- Based on income, age, disability, and other factors
- Continuous enrollment throughout the year
- The **Health Connector** is the state's online marketplace for health and dental coverage plans
- Available for individuals, families and small businesses
- Eligibility for savings / subsidies varies based on income and household size
- Open Enrollment periods and special enrollment periods apply for individual and family plans
- For small employers, Health Connector for Business offers rolling open enrollment

# Applying through MAhealthconnector.org

## Apply if you:

- Live in Massachusetts
- Are a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or are otherwise lawfully present in the U.S.
- Don't have insurance

## Do not apply if you:

- Are enrolled in Medicare, MassHealth (Medicaid), or other public health coverage
- Are offered affordable, comprehensive health insurance from an employer
- Are in jail

## You will need:

- **Social security numbers** for everyone applying, if they have one
- **Immigration documents** for all non-U.S. citizens who are applying, if they have one.
- Recent **pay information** such as:
  - Net income from self-employment
  - Copies of your last two pay stubs
  - Information about your current income if you didn't file taxes last year or your income has changed since last year
- If you don't have all the information above give us what you have. You'll get a letter asking for more information if needed.

# Health Connector for Business: Is This Right for You?

Health Connector for Business offers coverage options for small employers in Massachusetts to offer health and dental insurance to their employees

These plans may be a good fit if your small business:

- Doesn't currently offer insurance but you want to
- Wants flexibility and plan choice for your employees
- Has staff with a range of needs and budgets
- Wants more control over how much you contribute

# Health Connector for Business - Eligibility

Employers must meet certain requirements to offer coverage

1. Is a small employer, employing one (1) to no more than fifty (50) full-eligible employees
2. Has at least one non-owner, nonfamily member enrolled as an employee
3. Has a physical address located in Massachusetts

## Additional Requirements:

For a group's coverage to become active, the group must have at least 75% of employees waiving or enrolling into coverage along with initial binder payment (typically due on the 23<sup>rd</sup>) paid on time.

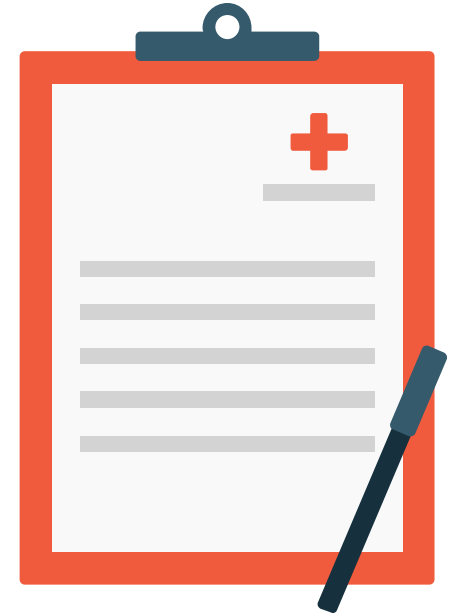

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# MassHealth Overview



# MassHealth: Populations We Serve

MassHealth provides health benefits to qualifying children, families, seniors, and people with disabilities in Massachusetts. MassHealth members have access to doctor visits, dental coverage, prescription drugs, behavioral health services and other important healthcare services.

## Individuals & Families



- Individuals younger than 65 and not living in or about to go into a nursing facility
- Individuals of **any age** who are
  - Parents of children younger than age 19
  - Adult relatives living with and taking care of children younger than 19 when neither parent is living in the home

## Seniors & People Needing Long-Term-Care

- Individuals older than 65 and living at home
- Individuals of **any age** needing long-term-care services in a medical institution or nursing facility
- Individuals eligible under certain programs to get long-term-care services living at home (individuals with disabilities)
- Members of a married couple living with a spouse who is 65 years of age or older

# Coverage Types for Individuals & Families Population

## Main Coverage Types

### Standard

- Full MassHealth healthcare benefits

### CommonHealth

- Full benefits for **disabled adults and children** not eligible for Standard

### CarePlus

- Broad benefits for adults not eligible for Standard

### Family Assistance

- Benefits for **certain children and adults not eligible for standard (including some noncitizens)**

Members with these coverage types must enroll in a health plan

## Special Programs

### Limited\*

Emergency services only due to immigration status that keeps them from getting more services.

### Children's Medical Security Plan (CMSP)\*

Primary and preventative **care for uninsured children** who do not qualify for any other MassHealth coverage

### Health Safety Net\*

Helps pay for services at acute **hospitals and community health centers to Massachusetts residents** who are uninsured or underinsured

\* - these coverage types are not considered as an insurance for tax purposes

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# MassHealth Premium Assistance



# What is MassHealth Premium Assistance (PA)?

The MassHealth Premium Assistance (PA) program is for MassHealth members who have access to employer-sponsored health insurance (ESI) from a job or from another source, such as members of your household.

If you have MassHealth and have access to Employer Sponsored Insurance, you may:



- be able to get help paying for your share of the health insurance premium if you qualify for the PA program.
- may also receive with other out-of-pocket costs such as copayments, deductibles, and coinsurance.



# You may qualify for PA if:

- If you have access to employer-sponsored insurance (ESI) coverage that meets certain requirements
- If MassHealth determines that it is cost effective for the member to enroll in the PA program
- If at least one person covered by the ESI is eligible for MassHealth Premium Assistance; **and**
- If the ESI policyholder
  - is a MassHealth eligible member, **or**
  - lives with an eligible MassHealth member on Standard, CommonHealth, Family Assistance or Careplus

**Premium Assistance Program Application**   ESI-2

In order to determine eligibility for the MassHealth Premium Assistance Program for you and members of your household, we need more information from you AND your employer about your access to employer-sponsored health insurance coverage. Do not enroll in any health plan through your employer until we have reviewed the plan to see if it meets Premium Assistance program standards. We will send you a letter to tell you if you have to enroll in a plan if we decide a plan offered through your employer meets program requirements.

## ConnectorCare plans with Advance Premium Tax Credits (APTC)

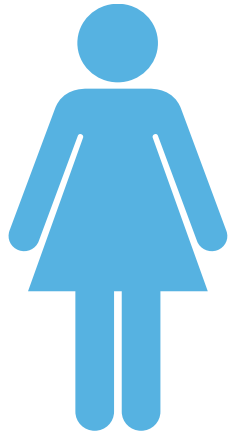

## Dental Plans

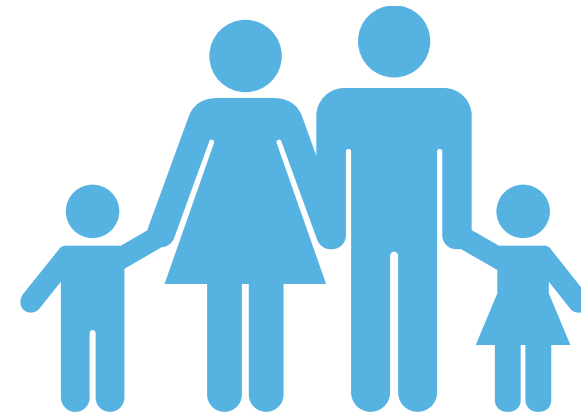
For individuals, children, families, and small employers; including pediatric-only plans and plans with lower and higher deductibles

# ConnectorCare: Income Limits for Eligibility

ConnectorCare has much lower premiums and co-pays  
and no deductibles



For 2026, the income range for one person is \$15,629 to \$62,600.



For 2026, the income for a family of four is \$32,150 to \$126,600.

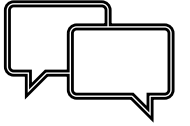
