The proposal by Melrose-Wakefield
Health to build a day
surgery center on the grounds

their plans.

These ideas don't spring up

I mailed in a letter to you regarding this matter, but with a short-time frame and Monday's Labor Day holiday I was not absolutely sure you will have received it by today's deadline.

This letter today echoes my concerns about Medford Surgery Center, LLC's request for an approval on the Determination of Need to build at Day Surgery Center on the parking lot of the Lawrence Memorial Hospital in Medford, MA.

This development group requesting DPH approval did not reach out to or share information with the neighborhood at large until information of the plans "slipped out" and neighbors responded resoundingly with concerns.

This is a quiet residential neighborhood, home to many elders who have lived here a long-time as well as new families with babies and small school-age children. The introduction of this major construction project, the increased traffic and noise- both during construction, and then ongoing during the operation of the center will bring increased auto traffic, walking dangers, noise and congestion to this community.

The development group has proceeded in the most secretive and non-transparent way. There has been, and continues to be, a lack of information and transparency at all stages of this process. There has been little or no detailed information shared about the current project and possible future projects on site (for example, construction of parking garage, changes in use of existing hospital building, etc.).

I recommend that the Department of Health reject or delay approval of this project until these concerns are properly addressed. Thank you for the opportunity to submit a statement regarding the application of Medford Surgery Center, LLC.
