What is the DPU?

- DPU oversees investor-owned electric power, natural gas, and water companies in Massachusetts.
- In addition, the DPU regulates the safety of bus companies, moving companies, and transportation network companies.
 We also oversee the safety of natural gas pipelines.
- Led by 3-member Commission

Priority: Increase Transparency

DPU is:

- Writing plain language summaries of decisions
- Developing case-specific webpages
- Responding to consumer questions

Priority: Improve Public Participation

DPU is:

- Hiring a <u>Director of Environmental Justice and Public</u>
 Participation
- Holding technical conferences and creating working groups
- Expanding Language Access
 - Expanding translation and interpretation
 - Multilingual public hearings
- Asking questions to utilities and petitioners based on public comments to gather evidence
- Responding to comments in decisions
- Increasing educational opportunities for the public





Priority: Adhere to Environmental Justice Principles

DPU is:

- Expanding clean energy benefits for environmental justice populations
- Improving review of municipal aggregation plans
- Inspecting pipelines, buses, rail to ensure safe operations
- Encouraging a just transition for workforce
- Emphasizing that clean energy transition is an opportunity to create job prospects for people who have been underrepresented in the workforce
- Valuing lived experiences of people







Priority: Clean Energy

DPU announced a:

- New regulatory strategy for natural gas in Massachusetts to guide the evolution to clean energy
 - Gas distribution companies must consider non-gas alternatives to gas expansion
 - Gas distribution companies will no longer recover costs to promote natural gas and submit plans every 5 years to demonstrate compliance with greenhouse gas emissions reduction limits.







Priority: Affordability

DPU:

 Opened a proceeding about <u>energy burden and</u> <u>affordability</u>.
