- **5. Discuss** COVID related Education program requests and progress and post COVID related advisory requests. P. Malagrifa mentioned that the education subcommittee will report on its recommendation related to this matter in more detail at item 6.
- 6. **Discuss** subcommittee meetings and reports:
  - a) **Regulation**\**CMR Subcommittee** Nothing to report
  - b) Education Subcommittee P. Malagrifa reported on the meeting held July 22. The subcommittee reviewed and approved @Leisure online, P&H University IEP, Chris Kelley CEP. With regards to online education, the subcommittee previously recommended no action be taken to continue the emergency policy expiring September 15. The subcommittee agreed at its meeting that it would not be appropriate to issue case by case extensions. As to other matters the subcommittee reported that a joint committee meeting with the CMR subcommittee will be scheduled in August to formulate regulation amendments pertaining to class size, DESE frameworks and instructor accreditation.

The chair allowed public comment: Erin Orcutt of Cape Cod Regional addressed the Board and indicated a desire to allow online learning to assist students who have hardships attending classes due to their geography.

- **7. Discuss** other matters not reasonably anticipated 48 hours in advance of the meeting. Nothing reported.
  - J. Bagni mentioned the following items for consideration:
    - Mr. Bagni is concerned that certain municipalities may be requiring information in excess of the standard permit form; in addition, some may be withholding issuance of permits in some cases absent receipt of insurance information which is being required even after the home owner has signed a waiver in accordance with the MEC rules. Legal counsel noted that these matters would typically be addressed by the BFPR/Fire Services. P. Vigneau stated that he refer the matter to appropriate parties.

P. Malagrifa made a motion B. Driscoll seconded and the Board unanimously voted to close the hearing and enter quasi-judicial session.
