Massachusetts Board State Examiners of Electricians **CMR Subcommittee Meeting Minutes** November 6, 2023

Conducted remotely via Microsoft Teams meeting

1. The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 12:00 P.M.

The following Board members were present:

John Bagni, MAVA Member (chair) Brendan Driscoll, Journeyman Electrician Member Paul J. Malagrifa, International Municipal Signal Association, Member Gerald Graham, Inspector of Wires Member Renee Dozier. Master Electrician Member

1. Review Minutes of the meeting May 20, 2022

B. Driscoll made a motion, R. Dozier seconded and it was so unanimously VOTED: to approve the minutes as presented.

- 2. Discussed potential amendment of 237 CMR 18.01 (2) regarding advertisement requirements.
 - After discussion the subcommittee agreed to no change.
- 3. Reviewed/Discussed any additional changes that may be needed in 237 CMR
 - Regarding apprentice hours and employer responsibilities the subcommittee recommended an amendment that would require employers to provide hours at separation.
 - 13.03 (1) The subcommittee discussed work experience prerequisite for the Journeyman exam, on possibility of eliminating the "in no less than 4 years" of attaining 8000hrs.

Some members spoke in favor of eliminating it based on the fact that OT is in play, and that education does not have a time limit. Board counsel mentioned many Boards follow this path as it tends to be more of a national standard. Potential for fraud was mentioned as a reason for Boards to potentially limit the hours over the course of a certain year threshold. Discussed potentially requiring payroll records for any application containing over 2000hrs in a calendar year for work experience. Discussion then centered around a possible change to 3yrs as the new threshold with an audit of payroll records for any 8000hrs total achieved in under 4yrs. No decision was reached

- 4. Discussed other matters not reasonably anticipated 48 hours in advance of the meeting.
 - Discussed the proposed regulations adopting the 300hr DESE Frameworks would need to be expanded to meet the 600hr. Journeyman program.
 - The Executive Director mentioned that based on the current exam applicants there are not many who apply from Maine, however reciprocity may be worth investigating due to the proximity of the states.

5. Adjournment

At 10:51 A.M. B. Driscoll made a motion P. Malagrifa, seconded and it was so unanimously VOTED: to adjourn.
