Barge Relocation from Center Arch to Cambridge-side Arch

What is happening?

MassDOT and their Contractor will be relocating the construction barge from the Center arch to the Cambridge-side arch on Tuesday, August 26, 2025 at 7:00 a.m. This relocation is in adherence to the planned repairs of the Cambridge-side arch. The construction barge will be in the Cambridge-side arch until Winter. Please follow the directions of the marine details and proceed with caution.



How will this affect you?

The relocation of the construction barge will commence on Tuesday, August 26, 2025, at 7:00 a.m. and take several hours to safely complete. During this time, the center arch and Cambridge-side arch may be closed simultaneously and only when necessary. The Boston-side arch will remain open to marine traffic at all times. A request for an additional marine detail has been submitted and if available, will be on site, at a minimum there will be a detail in the water. Once the turbidity booms, buoys, and channel markers have been repositioned for work in the Cambridge-side arch, the barge will be pushed into place. The Cambridge-side arch will be closed to marine traffic until further notice. At this time, the center arch will reopen, allowing marine traffic in both the Boston-side and center arches. Please proceed with caution and follow the directions of all marine details.

As a reminder, channel markers and buoys will be positioned in the waterway leading up to the bridge in both directions to warn and guide boaters. The work zone under the Cambridge-side arch and storage areas will be lined with channel markers and buoys.

Travel Tips

Please take care to pay attention to all traffic control devices. Miscellaneous work may take place outside of the established work zones and will be scheduled for nighttime hours to minimize waterway traffic impacts to the greatest extent possible. The work zone and storage areas will remain in the river for the duration of this operation.
