#### **Call to Order:**

Mr. Phaneuf called the meeting to order at 10:21 a.m. Board staff reviewed building evacuation procedures and noted the location of restrooms.

Ms. Leombruno moved to accept staff prepared public session minutes of the meeting held on December 17, 2019. Mr. Gormley seconded the motion. Motion passed, all Board members present voting in favor.

Ms. Leombruno moved to approve the candidates for licensure. Mr. Gormley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Leombruno moved to grant Mr. Buonfiglio and Ms. Forastiere a one-year extension of their embalmer apprentice registrations on the condition that they submit letters of enrollment. The registrants may apply for an additional extension at the time of license renewal on the condition that they submit letters of enrollment in mortuary studies. They do not need to reappear before the Board. Mr. Gormley seconded the motion. Motion passed by all Board members present.

#### **Application Review:**

After a brief discussion with Mr. McFarlane and his prospective employing Type 3 supervisor, Gary Toye, Ms. Leombruno moved to approve Mr. McFarlane to take the written practical and jurisprudence exams and proceed with the Out-of-State application for funeral registration. Mr. Gormley seconded. Motion passed by all Board members present.

## **Consent Agreement Review:**

The Board reviewed a proposal for monitoring related to dockets 2019-00139-IT-ENF and 2019-1040-IT-ENF per executed consent agreement. After discussion, Ms. Leombruno moved to delegate Board Chair to review the choice of three monitors with Board staff. Mr. Gormley seconded the motion. Motion passed by all Board members present.

## **Report from Executive Director, Michael Hawley**

Mr. Hawley reported that he is working with Mr. Robert Williams to determine an accurate number of Type 3 Funeral Directors who did not renew their license registration in October, 2019. He stated that he will provide a report at a subsequent meeting. Mr. Hawley reminded the Board that license renewal applications for funeral registrants will be processed online beginning in July, 2020; paper renewal applications will no longer be mailed out and registrants must create online accounts to complete the renewal process. In addition, Mr. Hawley announced that all funeral-related applications for registrants and establishments will be submitted online through the Board's ePLACE portal. Mr. Hawley noted that as of the Board's meeting, approximately fifty preneed reports have been submitted in anticipation of the January 31, 2020 deadline. The Board chair requested that Board staff provide a list of all Type 3 Funeral Directors without a validly renewed license and an update on the number of preneed reports received at the subsequent Board meeting.
