



Everything You Ever Wanted to Know About Cherry Sheets



- Official notification from the Commissioner of Revenue of the upcoming fiscal year's state aid and assessments
- Named for the cherry-colored paper on which it was originally printed
- Estimates posted on the DLS website



STORY OF THE STORY


- Cherry Sheets include receipts and assessments
 - Receipt programs include those based on a formula and those based on reimbursement for a cost incurred by the community
 - Examples of distributions include chapter 70, unrestricted general government aid (UGGA) and state-owned land
 - Reimbursements include programs like veterans' benefits, exemptions and charter reimbursements
 - Assessment programs are deductions to state aid for services provided through the Commonwealth or by another community
 - State assessments included services like mosquito control and retiree health insurance premiums
 - > Transportation assessments
 - Tuition assessments
 - Annual charges for loan type programs



- DLS updates the estimates during each budget iteration
- How do I know when an updated version has been released?
- For my local planning purposes what is the state budget cycle?
 - Starts with the Governor's budget proposal
 - Legislature makes their recommendations using the Governor's budget as a base
 - Any differences between the two legislative bodies are compromised in a conference committee report
 - Once it lands on the Governor's desk, he has 10 days to review, approve or make line-item vetoes and sign the bill into law
- The chart on the next slide graphically shows the budget cycle



State Budget Cycle



- Final budget has been signed
- Cherry sheets are updated to reflect final budget
- DLS alert prepared and sent
- Now what?
 - > Update the tax rate recapitulation sheet with final estimates
 - » Page 2 of the tax recap is updated to show the final offsets (line IIb 5), state and county charges (line IIc) and cherry sheet receipts (line IIIa – 1) see next slide
 - » But wait, I already set my rate!
 - > Prepare for the upcoming Fiscal Year monthly local aid payments

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- What have we learned?
 - Cherry sheets are required under MGL

 - They really were printed on cherry color paper at one time
 - The updates should provide local officials guidance during the local budget process
 - The data is used by assessors when completing and submit the tax recap
