EOEA funds services provided by an Aging Services Network that includes:

Aging Service Access Points (ASAPs): 25 regional ASAPs serve every community in the Commonwealth, proving information, referral, and access to State Home Care program, protective services, nutrition, family caregiver support, and other support services.

Councils on Aging: Municipal agencies located in **350 MA communities,** providing a focal point for social and support services for older adults, families and caregivers.

Area Agencies on Aging: Federally designated regional agencies that receive Older Americans Act funds and support a wide range of local services, including information and referral, caregiver support and nutrition.

Aging and Disability Resources Consortia (ADRC): Located regionally at the ASAPs to provide consumers with information and referral, options counseling, and assistance with decision support and service planning. ADRCs aim to address each individual's unique needs, goals, and choices to live independent lives in the setting of their choice.
