Purpose: To share the publication of the Federal Interagency Reentry Council "Reentry

MythBuster" series, which is aimed at dispelling commonly held

misunderstandings about Federal policies that affect ex-offenders and their

reentry into society.

Background: On August 30, 2011 the U.S. Department of Labor and Training Administration (ETA) published Training and Employment Notice No. 8-11, Federal Interagency Reentry Council "Reentry MythBuster" Series.
