Peoples Super Liquor Stores, Inc. dba Douglas Wine & Spirits (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 13, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Jamie Binienda's Compliance Check Field Report.

## **FACTS**

- 1. On June 3, 2011 at approximately 4:03 p.m., Commission Investigators investigated the business operation Peoples Super Liquor Stores, Inc. dba Douglas Wine & Spirits.
- 2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a six (6) pack of Bud Light for six dollars and seventy-nine cents (\$6.79). The underage operative was not asked for identification.
- 3. Administrative review of the licensee's files indicates the license has one (1) prior violation in twenty (20) years of existence.

## CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
