



The 2022 National Strategy to Support Family

Caregivers was created to support family caregivers of all ages, from youth to grandparents, regardless of where they live or what caregiving looks like for them and their loved ones. The National Strategy offers approximately 350 actions the federal government will take to support family caregivers in the coming years and 150 practical steps states, communities, and the private sector can take to build a system that ensures family caregivers have what they need to maintain their health, well-being, & financial security.
