How did we get here?

June 2014

Corridor Planning Study completed. Encompass ed eight working group meetings and two public informational meetings.

Why was this project initiated?

Route 79 cuts off access from neighborhoods to the waterfront





Route 79 is a physical and visual barrier blocking views of the Taunton River





High speed limited access highway constrains opportunities to create sense of destination





Roadways occupy large footprint limiting opportunities for waterfront development









Project Scope

Project Goals and Objectives

- Promote economic growth by creating new developable parcels along the waterfront
- Reestablish connectivity between neighborhoods and the waterfront
- Transform the corridor into vibrant multi-modal community





Overview and Highlights



- Replaces Expressway with one way paired, low speed boulevards
 - 2-11' travel lanes with 4' shoulders
 - 14' wide shared use paths on outside
 - Sidewalk around infield
- Creates 3 new cross street connects and enhances 2 existing
 - New at Turner, Hathaway, and Brightman

- Enhanced at Southern U-turn and President Ave \bullet
- Improvements for stormwater \bullet
 - New water quality basins
- New culverts to support sewer separation projects Removes 3 bridges and replaces 1 ullet
- New bridge for Route 79 over southern u-turn • New streetscape and accessibility improvements



Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements









Final Design Development

Approach to Final Design and Construction

Roadway and intersection design

- Reduce vehicle speeds at intersections
- Minimize amount of pedestrian/bicycle/vehicle conflicts

Structures and Streetscape design

- Optimize drainage and utilities and minimize visual impact
- Minimize maintenance for bridge and walls
- Cohesive landscape design with lighting, structures and utilities

Construction Staging

- Compliance with permitting
- Create large work zones and maintain traffic patterns
- Keep construction separate from public roadways as much as possible



Optimized Bridge Width

- Extends proposed roadway width south across bridge over southern u-turn
- Slows vehicles entering new low speed roadways
- Improves safety at existing Davol Street exit

Route 79 NB over Southern U-turn



Example: City Pier outfall

Reduced Impacts to River

- Outfalls pulled closer to water edge
- Shorter in-water work times
- No driven cofferdams



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Refined Intersections

- Slower turning vehicles
- Aligned crossing for shared use paths
- Crosswalks more visible at intersection









Construction Overview

Overall project timeline – approximately 4 years

- Work to occur mostly during the day and weekdays \bullet
- Some night work is needed for Bridge Demolition, Culvert installation, and utility work lacksquare
- Coordination with emergency services to maintain access routes ۲

Construction

- Major earthwork operations will be within confined work zones •
- Minimize construction vehicles on active parts of Davol Street

Mitigation: Noise and Dust control

- noise monitoring systems
- scheduling of activities based on weather and events \bullet
 - Work hours 7am to 3:30 pm
- water spray for dust suppression ۲



Temporary Traffic Considerations

Local roadway users

- Wayfinding signage for all pedestrian routes \bullet
- Detours on nights and/or weekends announced in advance \bullet
- Traffic patterns on Davol Street and cross streets will stay similar to existing
- All driveways remain open ullet
- No closures of shared use path \bullet

Regional

- Signage notifying traffic to use Route 24 ۲
- No lanes on Route 79/Davol closed during peak traffic times •



Staging Approach



SB Davol Street Looking North shown

Looking South at Veterans Memorial Bridge



- Temporary pavement is placed to provide width for two travel lanes on Davol Street
- Route 79 Expressway
 remains open
- Corey Street U-turn is widened to provide north to south u-turn



Stage 2A

Looking South at Veterans Memorial Bridge



- All traffic uses Davol Street.
- Reversing traffic uses
 Corey Street U-turn
- On street parking on Davol minimally impacted.
- Work this stage includes:
 Bridge Demo
 Earth moving
 - Utilities



Stage 2A

Looking South at Turner Street



- Pedestrian access at southern u-turn maintained
- On street parking on Davol minimally impacted.
- Work this stage includes:
 - Bridge Demo
 - Earth moving
 - Utilities



Stage 2B

Looking South at President Ave



- Route 79 Expressway and bridges removed
- On street parking on Davol removed.
- Work this stage includes:
 - construct left half of proposed road and temp paving
 - construct cross streets
 - Earth moving
 - Utilities



Looking South at Veterans Memorial Bridge



- Other cross streets open
- On street parking on Davol still closed.
- Work this stage includes:

 construct Route 79 SB
 construct remainder of
 Brightman St
 construct right half of
 road and SUP
 Stormwater and
 Lighting



Looking South at President Ave



- Other cross streets open
- On street parking on Davol still closed.
- Work this stage includes:

 construct Route 79 SB
 construct remainder of
 Brightman St
 construct right half of
 road and SUP
 Stormwater and
 Lighting



Looking South at President Ave



- All cross street open
- Work at Veterans Memorial Bridge complete
- On street parking open.
- Work this stage includes: – final infield work – landscape and stormwater basins - final curb and sidewalks

30 day lookahead

Upcoming Work

Stage 1 Temporary Paving

- Approximately 3 weeks \bullet
- Widen Davol Street NB and SB at ramp connections to Route 79 \bullet
- Localized drainage added for temporary use •
- Repave and widen Corey Street U-turn to create north to south u-turn ۲
 - Temporary closure of u-turn with traffic using President Ave Connection

Stage 2A – Permanent Expressway closure

- Notification 2 weeks in advance •
- Parking is retained through winter on Davol Street •
- Regional and local signing added •
- Earthwork and bridge demolition activates begin ۲
