Honorable Chairs and Ranking Minority Members of the Committees on Ways and Means:

Pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 14 of the General Laws¹, the Department of Revenue (DOR) hereby submits its mid-month tax revenue report for the month of February 2023, the eighth month of fiscal year 2023. The attached table shows February 2023 month-to-date tax revenue collections through February 15, 2023, along with changes from the equivalent period in February 2022.

Revenue collections are uneven and usually weighted toward month-end. The brief period covered in the mid-month report does not provide sufficient data for comparison to prior years. Therefore, mid-month figures should not be used to assess trends or project future revenues.

Context for February Revenues

February has historically been the lowest month for revenue, contributing less than 6% of annual collections. Neither individual nor business taxpayers are required to make estimated payments during the month. February is also the month in which refunds reach substantial levels as the tax filing season begins.

Highlights

Total Tax collections for the month-to-date period were \$956 million, \$57.0 million or 6.3% more than the collections during the same period in February 2022. The month-to-date increases in income tax withholding and sales tax were offset by decreases in non-withholding income tax.

- **Income Taxes** totaled \$722 million, up \$35 million or 5.2% versus the same period in February 2022.
- Sales & Use Taxes totaled \$124 million, up \$17 million or 15.9% versus the same period in February 2022.
- **Corporate & Business Taxes** totaled \$42 million, up \$3 million or 8.1% versus the same period in February 2022.
- Other Taxes totaled \$69 million, up \$1 million or 1.9% versus the same period in February 2022.

Details

Total Income Tax of \$722 million for mid-month February is comprised of the following:

- **Withholding** of \$729 million, up \$52 million versus the same period in February 2022.
- **Estimated Payments** of \$20 million, down \$5 million versus the same period in February 2022.
- **Returns/Bills** of \$34 million, up \$7 million versus the same period in February 2022.
- **Refunds** of \$61 million, up \$18 million (unfavorable) versus the same period in February 2022.

Sales & Use Tax of \$124 million, up \$17 million versus the same period in February 2022. Typically, only a small proportion of expected regular sales and meals tax remittances is received by the mid-month date. The month-to-date sales and use tax of \$124 million is comprised of the following:

- Regular sales tax of \$52 million, up \$4 million versus the same period in February 2022.
- Meals tax of \$23 million, up \$6 million versus the same period in February 2022.

• **Motor vehicle** sales tax of \$48 million, up \$8 million versus the same period in February 2022.

Corporate & Business Tax of \$42 million, up \$3 million versus the same period in February 2022. The month-to-date increase is mostly due to an increase in corporate and business estimated payments, partially offset by a decrease in refunds.

Other Taxes of \$69 million, up \$1 million versus the same period in February 2022, includes a number of tax categories such as motor fuels, cigarette, estate tax, room occupancy, and deeds.
