Call to Order: Co-chairperson Farooq Siddique called the meeting to order at 12:33 p.m. The Board members in attendance were, Maria Pinaud, Dr. Gail Batchelder, David Austin, Debra Listernick, Marc J. Richards, Kathleen Campbell, Farooq Siddique, and Gregg McBride. Board member Kirk Franklin was absent. Staff members Beverly Coles-Roby and Richard Friend were present. Wendy Rundle, Executive Director of the LSP Association ("LSPA") Marilyn Wade, LSPA President, and Wes Stimpson of WES Associates, were also present.

With respect to Course A5, <u>Applied Groundwater Modeling with Visual MODFLOW Flex</u>, Dr. Batchelder asked how many credits the provider requested. Mr. Siddique said that the provider asked for twenty-one, and that was what the Committee should recommend. Dr. Batchelder thought that the course could qualify for twenty-two credits because of the half hour break. The Committee voted to recommend approval for twenty-one technical credits.

Ms. Coles-Roby discussed an inquiry from a former LSP who voluntarily allowed his license to lapse. In a written request, he indicated that he will not hold himself out to be an LSP going forward and asked that his personal information, specifically his phone number and email contact information, be scrubbed from the public website. Dr. Batchelder said that the public has a right to know some information. Ms. Coles-Roby commented that she not received a prior such a request. She added that typically the person is listed as "lapsed." Dr. Batchelder thought that we should examine the practices of other licensing boards in Massachusetts. Ms. Coles-Roby said

that no information would be purged from the Board's files in order to comply with the Records Retention laws of the commonwealth. Ms. Listernick thought that the information could be deleted from the Board's searchable database on its website. Dr. Batchelder said that she did not think that the person's former employer's information was relevant. Mr. Richards summarized by saying that the email address; phone number; and employer could be deleted. Ms. Pinaud added that his name; license number; status; and history of discipline, if any, should remain on the website.

The Committee next discussed the LSPA electronic mails included in the packet. Ms. Coles-Roby said that the "Pending Approval Attendance Certificate Forms" were problematic. Although clearly marked "not accepted as documentation for renewal submission," LSPs often submit them to the Board. Ms. Listernick again directed the Committee's attention to the regulation which requires that course approval requests be submitted two months before the offering date. Dr. Batchelder asked what the standard practice is with respect to the Pending Forms. Mr. McBride wanted to know the purpose of the forms if they do not provide anything that an LSP can submit. He did not see any reason for the Board to issue Pending Approval Forms. Ms. Coles-Roby said that there is no regulatory requirement that the Board issue the forms. Ms. Rundle said that she did not know why the Board will cease doing so.

The Committee also discussed the email thread regarding Course No. 1232, *Hydrogeology of Massachusetts*. Ms. Coles-Roby said that the issue arose when an LSP submitted the course as part of his Application to Renew LSP License, and there were no administrative records that the course had been offered. Ms. Wade, the LSPA President, apologized for the error which occurred two years ago when the LSPA was undergoing a transition. New staff had joined the LSPA team and were in training. She went on to say that it was possible an honest mistake was made, but there was no motivation to alter any Board forms which goes against everything that they try to do. Mr. Smith said that he did not think that issuance of Attendance Certification Forms for Announcements needed to be held until after the Board meeting where the courses met the regulatory requirements for re-approval per 309 CMR 3.09(6)(c).
