








## January Precipitation & Departures

### Accumulated Precipitation (inches) January 01, 2025 to February 01, 2025




Precipitation (inches)

Departures were 1 to 2 inches below normal








## 3 and 6 Month Percent of Normal

### Last 3 Months (Nov-Jan)

- Near normal (80-100%) across eastern/southeastern MA
- Below normal (60-80%) across western MA and Cape/Islands

Precipitation Percent of Normal November 01, 2024 to February 01, 2025





### Last 6 Months (Aug-Jan)

- Mostly below normal (60-80 percent)
- Parts of western MA well below normal (40-60%)


### Precipitation Percent of Normal August 01, 2024 to February 01, 2025

## 7 Day Precipitation Forecast


Through Wed February 12th


- Several opportunities for precipitation through middle of next week  $\circ$  Today

- I to 2 inches of liquid precipitation possible by next Wednesday






### **7 Day WPC Precipitation Forecast**





## Outlook: Wed Feb 12 - Tue Feb 18


### Odds favor above below precipitation and below normal temperatures









## Outlook: Feb 15 - Feb 28











## Outlook for Feb, Mar, Apr

Odds favor above normal temperatures with no clear signal for above/below normal precipitation











## Summary

- January: Slightly Below normal temperatures and below normal precipitation • Precipitation was generally below to slightly below normal (1-2) inches for January • Temperatures were I to 3 degrees below normal on average

### Longer Range Precipitation Departures:

- ranging from 40 to 80 percent of normal across The Commonwealth
- 3-month and 6-month departures starting to show signs of long term dryness with 6 month PON • 3-month departures only slightly below normal across most of eastern and southeastern MA

### Outlook:

- Active weather pattern over the next week will provide several opportunities for precipitation • I-2 inches of new liquid equivalent precipitation forecast through Wednesday • Odds favor below average temperatures and above normal precipitation through the end of February
