## MASSACHUSETTS GENERAL PERMIT AUTHORIZING POTABLE WATER TREATMENT FACILITIES TO DISCHARGE POLLUTANTS TO SURFACE WATERS

In compliance with the provisions of the Massachusetts Clean Waters Act, as amended (M.G.L. Chap. 21, §§ 26 - 53) and the implementing regulations at 314 CMR 3.00 and 4.00, any facility authorized by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 1, under the 2023 NPDES Potable Water Treatment Facilities General Permit No. MAG640000, is authorized to discharge from the facility to the receiving water identified in its Permit Authorization from EPA in accordance with the following effluent limitations, monitoring requirements and additional conditions:

- 1. This permit shall become effective on October 1, 2023.
- 2. This permit shall expire five years after the effective date.
- 3. This permit supersedes the permit issued on March 6, 2017.
- 4. This permit incorporates by reference Part I, Applicability and Coverage; Part II, Obtaining Authorization to Discharge; Part III, General Permit Requirements; Part IV, Special Conditions; Part V, Monitoring, Record-keeping, and Reporting Requirements; Part VI, Administrative Requirements; and Part VII, Standard Conditions; as set forth in the 2023 Final NPDES Permit No. MAG640000, issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 1, on July 24, 2023 (the 2023 Final NPDES Permit) and available at <a href="https://www.epa.gov/npdes-permits/massachusetts-npdes-permits#dgp">https://www.epa.gov/npdes-permits/massachusetts-npdes-permits#dgp</a>; provided, however:
  - a. that the reporting required by Part III.E.1 shall be in accordance with 314 CMR 3.19(20)(e) (24-hour reporting);
  - b. that the notification required by Part IV.B shall also be provided to MassDEP;
  - c. that a copy of the requests, reports, and information required by Part IV.D to be submitted to EPA shall also be submitted to MassDEP electronically to <u>massdep.npdes@mass.gov</u> with the subject header "PWTF GP" and the facility name;
  - d. that, if there is a conflict between the definitions in 314 CMR 3.02 and/or 314 CMR 4.00 and the definitions in Part VII Standard Conditions, the definitions in 314 CMR 3.02 and/or 314 CMR 4.00 shall control, as applicable;
  - e. that the notifications required by 4.a. and 4.b. above shall be provided as follows:

5. This permit incorporates by reference the Standard Permit Conditions set forth in 314 CMR 3.19.
