



MASSACHUSETTS FIRE CHIEF RECREDENTIAL (FCRC) CANDIDATE APPLICATION

The Massachusetts Fire Chiefs credentialing and recredentialing program is intended to provide the opportunity for all full-time, call and volunteer applicants to demonstrate, through recognition at the highest level, their skills, knowledge and professional achievements that benefit their respective departments and the cities or towns they serve. Such recognition is critical to the ongoing professional development of both the individual in particular and the fire service, in general.

The Fire Service Commission, consistent with its mission, is dedicated to the development, oversight, and implementation of a credible and sustainable credentialing and recredentialing program that provides the opportunity to both recognize and foster the professionalism of the individual and fire service for the benefit of the citizens of the Commonwealth.

This credentialing program has been developed to promote career long learning, development and engagement in the fire service and is solely administered by the Massachusetts Fire Service Commission. Any officer holding the rank of Lieutenant or above shall be eligible to apply for credentialing. All qualified applicants are encouraged to participate in this voluntary program.

Any applicant aggrieved by a decision of the Fire Service Commission may petition for review for good cause. Any determination regarding review by the Commission shall be final.

An individual wishing to maintain the Fire Chief Credential will be required to accumulate 72 points of approved attendance/activities in a 36-month period that begins on the date of issuance of the Fire Chief Credential.

In the event a previously credentialed individual fails to acquire the minimum points in the 36-month period the Fire Chief Credential shall become void.

An individual previously awarded credential by the Fire Service Commission who has allowed it to expire and wishes to have the credentialing reinstated will be required to comply with the current minimum standards established for "re-credentialing". Minimum standards are defined as: accumulating the required points of approved attendance/activities in a consecutive 36-month period from the date of the submitted application and not prior to the initial/last credential date.

The Continuing Education component is designed to encourage that new achievement is made during each consecutive 36 month period. This includes remaining current and active with organizations and committees and by keeping your certifications current, if they require continuing education. The goal is to assist the credentialed Fire Chief in maintaining a higher level of professionalism within the fire service after initial credentialing.

CODE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

A key value within the fire and emergency service is strong, ethical and competent leadership. Most professionals abide by a Code of Ethics or Code of Conduct, which expresses their understanding of what constitutes acceptable behavior.

Abiding by these standards is required for continued recognition as a designated Fire Chief and serves notice to the public who entrust their confidence in the abilities and integrity of the Fire Chief. It is meant to foster the need for our fire chiefs to follow these codes in their daily professions as well as in their daily lives.

SECTION 1

We shall be dedicated to the concepts of effective fire protection by responsible fire chiefs and we believe that professional management is essential to the achievement of this objective. We pledge ourselves to advance the science of fire service through training courses and other methods to meet the proper requirements of our profession.

SECTION 2

We recognize that the most important function of local fire departments is to serve the best interests of the community.

SECTION 3

We shall be dedicated to the highest ideals of personal character, honor and integrity in all public and personal relationships in order that fire chiefs may merit the respect and confidence of the community.

SECTION 4

We shall refrain from participating in political activities which may impair our performance as professional administrators.

SECTION 5

We shall handle all matters in our best judgment so that fairness and impartiality govern our decisions.

SECTION 6

We shall observe all of the provisions of the Constitution of the United States, the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and all applicable local statutes.

SECTION 7

We shall make known the risks to be anticipated, should the fire chief's professional recommendations be disregarded by others.

SECTION 8

We shall recognize the professional competence and the mutual dependence of all fire chiefs and we pledge cooperation to those professionals and agencies concerned with the improvement of fire protection.

- Max Points Awarded FCRC: 70

Examples of approved organizations include: Accredited colleges or universities (*if not counted in a degree for which you have previously received points*), fire attack schools, weekend seminars or workshops, Massachusetts Firefighting Academy, National Fire Academy, chiefs' conferences, vendor courses, and other learning institutions.

CATEGORY 8: PROFESSIONAL MEMBERSHIPS

- Membership Organizations must be fire, rescue and/or emergency services related
- Enter dates of active membership during the 36-month recredentialing period
- Attach copies of membership cards or letter acknowledging membership
- 1 point awarded per year served per membership
- Max Points Awarded FCRC: 20

Examples of approved organizations include: the International Association of Fire Chiefs, Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts, New England Association of Fire Chiefs, International Association of Arson Investigators, NFPA and District Organizations etc.

CATEGORY 10: PROFESSIONAL CONTRIBUTIONS: BOARDS/COMMISSIONS/TECHNICAL COMMITTEES

- Professional Contributions must be fire, rescue and/or emergency services related
- Memberships must be based on regional or statewide service, not at the municipal level and evidence a benefit to the fire service or the public as a whole
- Enter dates of active involvement during the 36-month recredential period
- Attach letter acknowledging role on board/committee
- 4 points awarded per year served per organization
- Max Points Awarded FCRC: 40

Examples of approved organizations include: Board of Fire Prevention Regulations, Hazardous Materials Advisory Board, 9-1-1 Commission, Massachusetts Homeland Security Councils, NFPA Technical Committees, etc.
