Marshal Ostroskey updated the Commission on the Fire Equipment Grant. The Department received approximately 300 applications and announcement will be sent out in the next couple weeks.

The Fire Academy Director position is being advertised and interviews will take place in the very near future.

The Department is also getting very close to completing the delineation of PFAS contamination and hope to have some additional excavation and soil removal this summer.

Deputy Marshal Fournier informed the Commission that to date the Department has received close to 400 approved applications for CT Scans sent to UMASS which is nearing the 800 that have been budgeted for by the end of the fiscal year, June 30, 2021. FF MacKinnon Jr. explained that he has received positive feedback from PFFM members.
