# D. General Issues and Updates from DFS

Marshal Ostroskey informed the Commission that effective June 15, 2021, Governor Charles Baker will be rescinding the virtual open meeting order under Mass. General Law Chapter 30A, Section 20, and in person meetings will resume. Department operations will be shifting as the orders change and updated guidelines are issued. The Department is working closely with the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security regarding how the agency moves forward.

As fireworks season is approaching, the Fire Investigation and Explosives Unit will be enhancing enforcement through July 1, 2021.

The Fire Safety Division is working with local police and fire departments on crafting advisories to raise awareness on updated regulation and statutes.

The National Firefighter Safety Stand Down will take place June 20<sup>th</sup> -26<sup>th</sup>. This year's theme is "Rebuild Rehab" for incident and planned events.

Deputy Marshal Fournier updated the Commission on the success of the CT Scans as part of Cancer in the Fire Service program. There is already a waitlist for FY22 if the funding is approved.
