The average household's leaks can account for nearly 10,000 gallons of water wasted every year. Ten percent of homes have leaks that waste 90 gallons or more per day.

Test your toilet for leaks and








Does your toilet have a silent leak? Drop a few drops of food coloring or a dye tablet into your toilet's tank and wait 10 minutes. If the dye shows up in the bowl, you have a leak that can probably be fixed by replacing

a worn toilet flapper.
Don't forget to flush
after to remove any
leftover dye.



Want to stop a
running toilet?
Replace a toilet
flapper in 6 easy
steps:









- 1. Turn off the water to your toilet
- 2. Remove tank cover and flush
- 3. Remove old flapper
- 4. Attach new flapper to pegs
- Reattach/adjust chain for a tight seal
- 6. Turn water on and flush



Pro tip: Before you buy a new flapper, take a photo inside your tank to make sure you buy the right one.
