Board Business:

The Board meeting was called to order at 10:01 a.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Board Business:

At the end of the open session, Chairperson Dunne indicated the Board would be entering into Executive Session to review firearms petitions whose subject matter is protected pursuant to G.L. c. 30A, § 21(a)(7) and G.L. c. 4, § 7. The Board would not reconvene in open session.

Lt. Ridlon made a motion to enter executive session for this purpose. Attorney Healy seconded the motion. A roll-call vote was taken to enter Executive Session and the motion carried unanimously (6-0). The Board entered executive session at approximately 10:06 a.m.
