Focus40 Overview

A 25-year plan for how the MBTA can meet the needs of the region in 2040.

- Required by the MBTA enabling legislation
- A roadmap of investments to feed future MBTA Capital Investment Plans



Programs: Highlighting the key families of investments that will allow the existing system to best serve the region over the long-term

Places: Identifying priority areas for new or improved service based on where investments have the greatest likelihood to deliver real benefits to the region

Focus40 is using a scenario planning framework to identify a robust investment portfolio that can withstand uncertainty, while still considering riskier, but potentially high impact strategies.

- Silver Line 2040
 - » Investments to ensure the MBTA's most capital intensive bus services support regional growth
- Bus 2040
 - » Transit priority investments to make buses faster and more reliable
- Water Transportation 2040
 - » Investments to maximize the role of this reliable transit mode in the region
- Commuter Rail Connections
 - » Pending completion of the MBTA Rail Vision process, charting a path for improving commuter rail – particularly better connections to important places and rapid transit

Urban Gateways beyond Rapid Transit

- These are places that have demonstrated transit needs and where the MBTA will:
 - Proactively advance partnerships
 - Study solutions
 - Prioritize in project selection
- The Focus40 Team is planning on highlighting illustrative places within each typology, demonstrating why they would help support broader regional goals such as affordable housing—and are likely to generate ridership, as well as types of strategies that could help address identified challenges.



Implementation

- Implementation through capital planning and project selection
 - Annual, pre-CIP review to track status, incorporate new information and set upcoming programmatic priorities
 - Incorporate F40 long-term policy priorities into project scoring
- Foundation for municipal and public-private partnerships
- Framework for follow-on studies:
 - Bus Network Redesign
 - Commuter Rail Vision
 - Studies/project development to advance Robust initiatives
 - Maintenance/storage facility site plans and acquisition
 - Reimagining park and rides & station parking
 - State-owned Roads Bus Priority Study
 - Planning studies in partnership with priority places
- Foundation for the Commission on the Future of Transportation in the Commonwealth
