The **Benefit Amount** awarded to eligible households is based on several household factors reflected in this chart. Those include the number of people in a household, their gross income, and whether a threshold is exceeded.

The **Water Arrearage Supplemental Help (WASH)** is an additional benefit provided only to qualifying, eligible LIHWAP households whose current water and/or wastewater arrearage(s) exceeds a listed WASH threshold.
