

**FY-09 Legislative Report**  
**Account #5920-5000 (Turning 22)**

Below you will find the FY-09 annual report to the House and Senate Committees on Ways and Means on the projected use of funds encumbered or expended for account #5920-5000 (Turning 22). This information highlights the number of individuals served in each region and the types of services purchased with the FY09 appropriation.

**Community Based Residential Services** – supports individuals in a wide range of living arrangements in the community. State and private vendors contracted with the Commonwealth manage the services. They range from small family settings to individual and group living situations.

**Day/Employment Services** – supports individuals on developing either non-work related skills or refining their work skills so they are able to find meaningful work. These programs use existing community resources and are managed by private vendors contracted with the Commonwealth.

**Transportation Services** – supports individuals in commuting to their day/employment services site. These programs offer a wide range of services from training to use public transportation to providing rides in authorized vehicles. State and private vendors contracted with the Commonwealth manage these.

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**Family Support Services** – offers an array of service supports to help families keep their loved ones at home. These service supports may include: community resources, respite care, special activities and other supports to help stabilize the family. Private vendors contracted with the Commonwealth manage these programs.
