



WHAT IS MVP? The MVP Program is a partnership between state and local communities to build climate resilience through grant-funded projects. Communities start with a planning grant, become an MVP-certified community, and then are eligible for action grant funding.

MVP PROCESS

1. PLAN

Complete MVP Planning 1.0 and achieve MVP designation by engaging community to identify hazards, vulnerabilities, and priority actions.

2. ACT

Use MVP Action Grant funding to implement priority resilience projects identified in MVP Planning 1.0.

3. REFOCUS

Conduct MVP 2.0 to update priorities, center equity, and spur action.

4. CONTINUE ACTING

Apply for more Action Grant funding to implement updated priority projects.

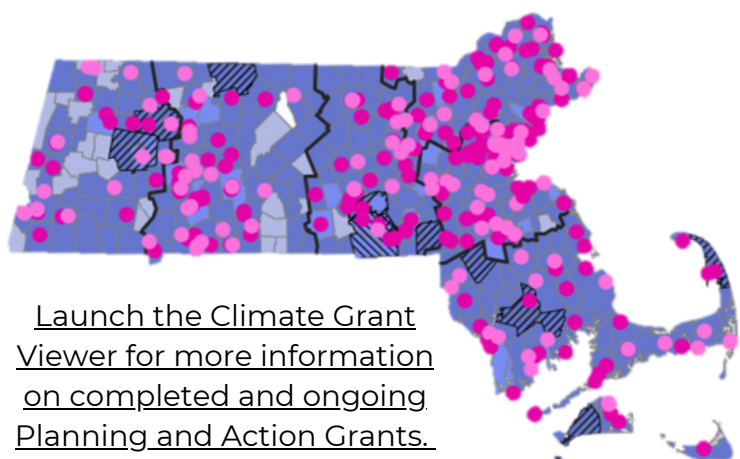
ACTION GRANTS

Applicant Eligibility: MVP-designated communities, Tribal Governments, political subdivisions of the Commonwealth

Funding Availability: Up to \$3M for community-scale proposals, \$5M for regional proposals (10% local match required; with exceptions)

Project Eligibility: Implementation of priority actions identified through MVP Planning and/or MVP Planning 2.0 processes. Project types include:

- Planning, Assessments, Capacity-Building, and Regulatory Updates
- Design and Permitting
- Construction and On-the-Ground Implementation
