DECISION

CJ Liquors, Inc. dba The Liquor Barn (“the licensee”) holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (“the Commission”) held a hearing on August 3, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Rose Bailey’s Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee’s Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Compliance Check Field Report of Investigator Rose Bailey.

There is one (1) tape of this hearing.

Facts

1. On, May 26, 2010 at approximately 6:58 p.m., Commission Investigators investigated the business operation of The Liquor Barn.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a pint of Bud Light for \$2.66. The underage operative was not asked for identification.
3. Administrative review of the file shows that the licensee has held ownership for 27 years and has had no prior violations.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. As the licensee has had no previous violations the Commission **issues a warning.**
