Project Budget and Funding


Budget and Funding

- Estimated total project cost ~ \$7.0 Million

 The total estimated cost of the project does not include any right of way acquisition costs.
- Federal Highway Administration funding 80% (Federal Aid)
- MassDOT funding 20% (remaining construction cost)
 - This project must be programmed in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) in the appropriate Federal Fiscal Year in order for MassDOT to solicit bids for eventual construction.

Why was this project initiated?



Project Goals

- Pavement rehabilitation
- Improvements for pedestrians and bicyclists
- Connection to the existing shared use path at King Street and Old Jacobs Road
- Bikeability
- Improved safety for all users
- Improve collection and treatment of stormwater runoff





What do we want to accomplish?

Proposed Improvements

- West Main Street (Route 97)
 - Reconstruction of existing roadway
 - Realignment of King Street Intersection
 - Shared-use path
 - ADA compliant path and curb ramps
 - New traffic signs and pavement markings
 - New closed drainage system
- King Street
 - Roadway resurfacing





King Street Intersection

- Intersection realigned to provide better sight lines for motorists
 - Includes raising the roadway to increase sight distance
- Roadway resurfacing to provide link with existing multi-use path







Parker River Crossing

- West Main Street raised to help alleviate flooding
 - New box culvert will be installed to prevent overtopping








Moulton Street Intersection

- Multi-use path ends on West Main Street
 - Will crossover to Moulton Street where it will be connected to a future MassDOT project



























































How will your property be impacted?

Right of Way (ROW) discussion – 25% Design

- Responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of a project.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the ROW Bureau or consultants representing MassDOT.
- Procedures must comply with state and federal regulations governing the acquisition process.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
 - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended.
- Fee takings, permanent easements, and/or temporary construction easements may be required.





What are the environmental, cultural resource, and community impacts?

Permitting

- MassDOT
 - Early Environmental Coordination Checklist (EECC)
 - Water Quality Certification
- Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA)
 - Environmental Notification Form (ENF)
- Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife (MassDFW)
 - Will review for impacts to Natural Heritage and Endangered Species Program (NHESP) mapped habitat
- Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) / Town of Georgetown Conservation Commission
 - Notice of Intent (NOI)
- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
 - Categorical Exclusion
- National Historic Preservation Act
 - Georgetown Historical Commission will review project and its compliance with Section 106 of the Act







What is the construction approach?

Proposed construction approach

- Abutter and property access will be maintained by the Contractor for the duration of the project
- Pedestrian, bicycle and motor vehicle access will be maintained
- Roadway closures and detours (if necessary) will be limited to short durations
- Night and weekend work will be considered on an as needed basis






