

Accelerated Repair Program - Updates

- After a temporary, one-year pause to the ARP in 2023, the MSBA Board of Directors
 voted to reopen the Program in 2024 with an increased estimated budget
 following the approval of the Commonwealth's FY 24 Budget, which provides that
 grant amounts related to the ARP shall not be calculated as part of the MSBA's
 Annual Cap limit
- Commencing this past January (2025), the ARP opened as a biennial Statement of Interest ("SOI") opening (every two years) with the next opening anticipated in 2027
- The MSBA believes that a biennial opening will provide more predictability and flexibility for district officials who are administering facilities improvements in their districts




Accelerated Repair Program - Updates

At the October 23, 2024 MSBA Board of Directors meeting, the ARP program was approved as follows:

Description	Recommendation
Window and Roof Restoration/Replacement	 \$300 million budget (over two-year period) Existing windows must be over the age of 30 years Existing roof must be over the age of 20 years
Heat Pump Conversion (NEW)	 \$250 million budget (over two-year period) Existing windows must be less than 30 years old Existing building must not have been opened (or renovated, incl. HVAC system) after 2010 Existing mechanical heating distribution is not supported by steam piping
