DECISION

Hao Ming Restaurant, Inc. dba Dragon Light (“The Licensee”) holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (“the Commission”) held a hearing on August 10, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Brad Doyle’s Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee’s Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Compliance Check Field Report of Investigator Brad Doyle.

There is one (1) tape of this hearing.

Facts

1. On, June 2, 2010 at approximately 7:29 p.m., Commission Investigators investigated the business operation Hao Ming Restaurant, Inc. dba Dragon Light.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a bottle of Budweiser for \$3.50. The underage operative was not asked for identification.

Conclusion

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for five (5) days.**
