DECISION

LORI A. WELLER DBA GYPSY JOYNT 293 MAIN STREET GREAT BARRINGTON, MA 01230 LICENSE#: 046400092

Lori A. Weller dba Gypsy Joynt (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 3, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) — Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and

2. Investigator Keefe's Investigative Report dated January 29, 2014.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Wednesday, January 29, 2014 at approximately 5:57 p.m., Investigators Kujawski and Keefe conducted an investigation of the business operation of Lori A. Weller dba Gypsy Joynt.
- 2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased a container of Budweiser Light beer for three dollars (\$3.00). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) — Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 — Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
