Who Does the Work?

Groton Trails Committee

- Chartered by Selectmen in March 1998
- Originally 15 members appointed; 9 since 2001

Trail Volunteers

- E-mail list notifications of projects to 100+ community volunteers
- Community Service Days (Groton School, Lawrence Academy)
- "Adjunct" Trail Committee Members with special skills, notably IT, GIS, and surveying
- Eagle Scout Service Projects
- Others (Mtn. bikers, land stewards, etc.)

Our Goals

To develop a network of trails, sidewalks/pathways, and dirt roads to provide safe and scenic connections between all neighborhoods of Groton for all non-motorized uses



- To research titles, easements, and boundaries to protect lawful public access to trails
- To educate the public on where they can find the public trails and where they go (and don't go)
- To educate the public on the history of the land they pass over and what they can see and do on the trails

What Do We Do?

- Build new trails
- Mark and maintain trails
- Offer monthly guided hikes
- Sponsor trail races in Town Forest (#16 in October 2013)
- Maintain a website to provide maps and information on trails and parcels
- PR: Man booth at GrotonFest and RiverFest; write articles for local newspapers


White: Through Yellow: Loop Blue: Connector Purple: Spur
