DECISION

PEPPER DINING, INC. DBA CHILI'S GRILL AND BAR ROUTE 9/ RUSSELL STREET HADLEY, MA 01035

L1CENSE#: 048200039 HEARD: 10/08/2013

Pepper Dining, Inc. dba Chili's Grill and Bar (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, October 8, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age.

Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kenny's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
- 2. Investigator Kenny's Compliance Check Field Report dated April 24, 2013.
- A. Responsible Alcohol Service Policy;
- B. Employee Handbook Page 1;
- C. Employee Handbook Page 2; and
- D. Staff Member Acknowledgement by Signature on Rules and Policies.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On April 24, 2013 at approximately 6:03 p.m., Investigators Teehan and Kenny conducted an investigation of the business operation of Pepper Dining, Inc. dba Chili's Grill and Bar.
- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a Bud Bottle for four dollars and twenty-seven cents (\$4.27). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138 §34 Sale or Delivery of an Alcoholic Beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. The licensee has been in business for fifteen (15) years and has no prior violations. Therefore, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
