DECISION

McLADDEN RESTAURANT GROUP HAMPDEN LLC DBA McLADDEN'S IRISH PUBLIC HOUSE
546 MAIN STREET
HAMPDEN, MA 01036

Mcladden Restaurant Group Hampden LLC dba Mcladden's Irish Publick House (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, May 20, 2014, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
 2. Investigator Keefe's Compliance Check Field Report dated February 26, 2014.


FACTS

1. On Wednesday, February 26, 2014, at approximately 5:24 p.m., Investigators Kujawski and Keefe conducted an investigation of the business operation of Mcladden Restaurant Group Hampden LLC dba Mcladden's Irish Publick House.
2. An underage operative, working with investigators, purchased a bottle of Budweiser Light beer for three dollars and twenty-five cents (\$3.25). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
