### **DECISION**

Saba Food Market, Inc. dba Bradford Shell (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c.138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on October 19, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Rose Egan-Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Compliance Check field report of Investigator Rose Egan-Bailey violation date July 15, 2010; and
2. Stipulation of Facts.
  - A. Signed Cashier Alcohol and Tobacco Policy of the Licensee dated July 7, 2010;
  - B. Signed Cashier Alcoholic and Tobacco Policy of the Licensee dated July 15, 2010;
  - C. Notice to Employees from Licensee regarding changes to the Alcohol and Tobacco Policy dated March 2009;
  - D. Signed Cashier Alcohol and Tobacco Policy of the Licensee dated July 22, 2010;
  - E. Letter to Marion Davis regarding training for Alcohol and Tobacco Carding dated July 26, 2010; and
  - F. Dram Shoppe Consultants TIPS Training Document.

There is one (1) tape of this hearing.

### Facts

1. On July 15, 2010 members of the Haverhill Police Department and Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission Investigators conducted compliance checks in the City of Haverhill.

2. At approximately 8:45 p.m. on July 15, 2010, an underage operative, working with the Haverhill Police Department, purchased a six-pack of Bud Light bottles for \$7.67 from Saba Food Market, Inc. dba Bradford Shell. The underage operative was not asked for identification.

### Conclusion

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for six (6) days of which four (4) days will be served and two (2) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
